The WRS 2014 Annual Business Meeting and election of officers will be held immediately following the luncheon and all members are invited to participate.

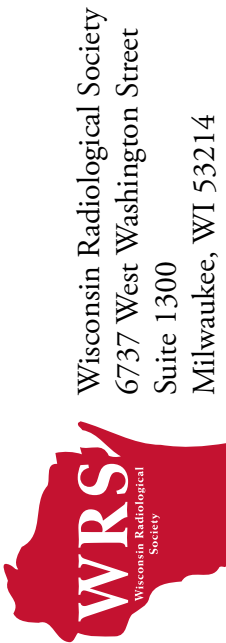

Kimberly Applegate, M.D. was elected Speaker of the American College of Radiology in 2013. She began her service in that role immediately following the 2013 ACR Annual Meeting and Chapter Leadership Conference. In this role, Dr. Applegate also serves on the ACR Executive Committee, ACR Board of Chancellors, Budget and Finance Committee, and Audit Committee.

Dr. Applegate currently practices pediatric radiology at Emory University in Atlanta, GA. She received the Gold Medal of the Indiana Radiological Society in 2010. She has also served as president of the IRS and is an elected member of both the National Council on Radiation Protection and the International Council of Radiation Protection and she was the RSNA Editorial Fellow in 2000.

Dr. Applegate received her BA from the University of California at Berkley and her medical degree from George Washington University Medical School. She also holds a MS in Epidemiology/Health Services Research from Case Western Reserve University in Cleveland, Ohio.

Dr. Applegate has been very active in multiple organizations. At the ACR, she has served as chair, ACR Guidelines and Standards Committee, served on the Council Steering Committee, chaired the College Nominating Committee, chaired the Member Engagement Task Force, served on the Governance Committee and was a member of the ACR Blue Ribbon Panel on Radiation in Medicine.

Dr. Applegate has also served as president of the Association of University Radiologists and Radiology Alliance for Health Services Research, President of the American Association for Women Radiologists, and serves on the Steering Committee of the Image Gently Campaign. She was recently appointed to the National Quality Forum’s Patient Safety Steering Committee.

My UW career spans a decade and currently I am an associate professor in the Departments of Radiology, Obstetrics and Gynecology. My current clinical and research focus is on gynecological imaging, more specifically the utility of MRI in ovarian, endometrial and cervical cancer. I have a breath of experience in the area of MRI research and have \$3,000,000 of NIH-funded research. I am a part of the ACRIN gynecological subcommittee, as well as the RSNA and ARRS scientific committees. Clinically, I’ve been involved in developing protocols for pre-operative imaging of endometrial cancer and ovarian cancer, as well as beginning a MRI-brachytherapy program at the UW. In addition to my work in the clinical and research arenas, I am actively involved in resident teaching and education, in addition to lecturing to practicing radiologists and gynecologists on a variety of gynecological imaging topics.
