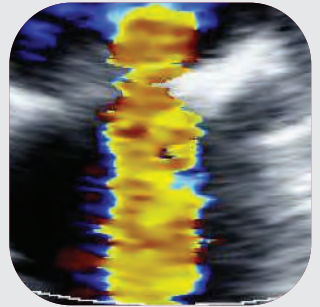

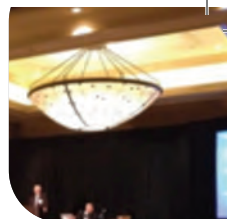

PROGRAM OVERVIEW

This Heart Valve Summit on the River, is designed to highlight case based decision making for the accurate diagnosis and effective treatment of heart valve disorders.
