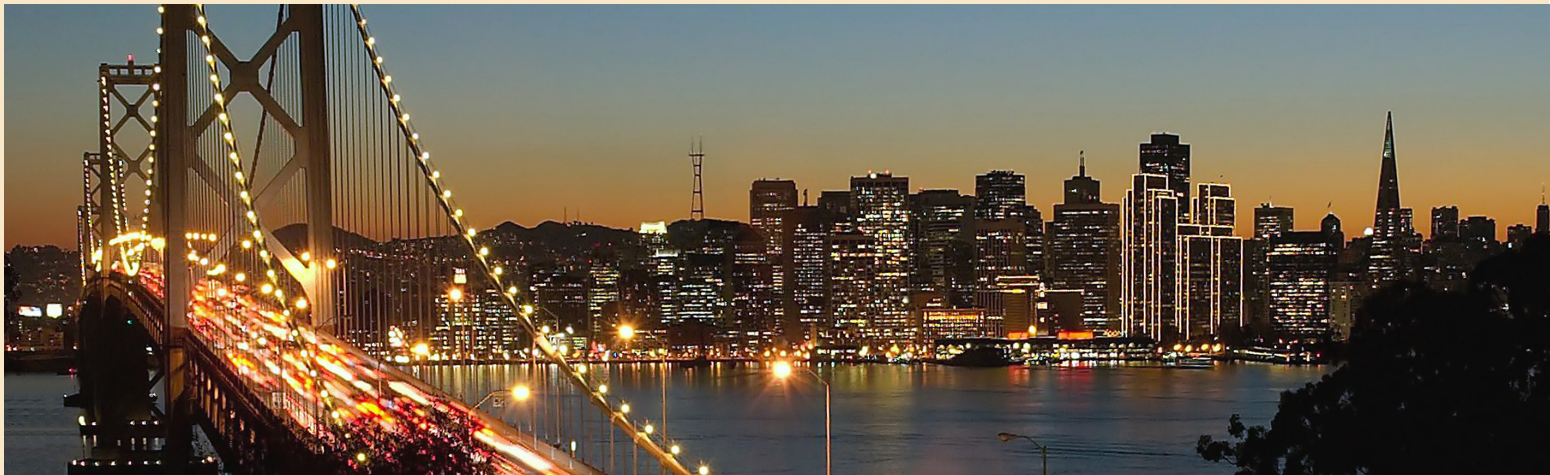
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Join us for the 2014 AANS/CNS Section on Pain Biennial Meeting at The Moscone Center in San Francisco.
The theme this year will be "Integrating Pain with Your Spine Practice."



New! Included in your registration will be a hands-on session utilizing simulators for spinal pain, including percutaneous, minimally invasive and paddle stations.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

The education sessions will be directed toward neurological surgeons, spine surgeons, pain management providers, residents, medical students, nurse clinicians and physician assistants, and will be directly applicable to their practices.

DESCRIPTION

At least 70 percent of neurosurgeons have a predominant spine practice; however, even spine surgeons interested in pain shy away from pain procedures because of concerns/misunderstandings about profitability, demands of pain population on office staff, and limited experience with the procedures. This session is geared at familiarizing attendees with the economics, politics and details of neurosurgical procedures for spinal and other pain syndromes.

- Describe the benefits of incorporating pain procedures into your practice from a practice development standpoint;
- Determine which patients are candidates for these procedures; and
- Describe techniques of spinal cord stimulation.
