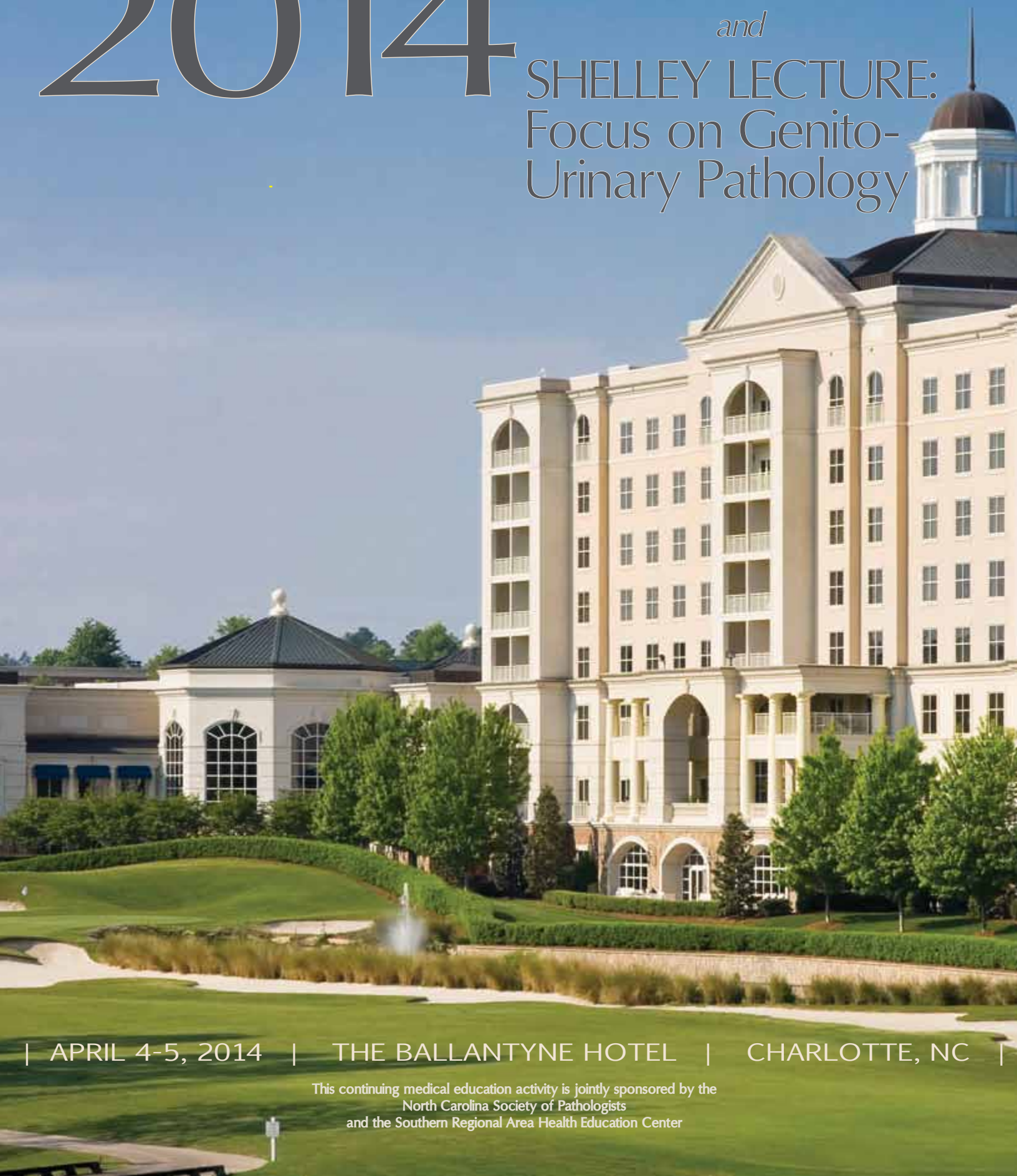

| SHELLEY LECTURE |

The NC Society of Pathologists is pleased to present this educational activity for pathologists in the southeast region, honoring the late William Shelley, MD, former chair of what was then the Charlotte Memorial pathology residency program and founder of what is now Carolinas Pathology Group. Upon Dr. Shelley's untimely death in 1974, a trust was established to offer education to pathologists in his honor.

| TARGET AUDIENCE AND PURPOSE |

This course is designed for practicing and academic pathologists, fellows, residents, and medical students, particularly those with an interest or involvement in genitourinary pathology. Many general pathologists see specimens from the genitourinary system sites; this activity will provide updated information from experts in the field to avoid misdiagnosis and to provide accurate prognostic information to clinicians. An open-discussion lunch roundtable will be featured, allowing state societies the opportunity to share best practices and challenges, and we will present non-clinical updates exploring the changing regulatory and health care environments and their effect on the practice of pathology. The Friday dinner will feature remembrances of the late Dr. Shelley, along with a presentation addressing the challenges of participating in accountable care organizations under the Affordable Care Act (ACA).

| KEYNOTE SPEAKER |

The NC Society of Pathologists is honored to welcome Jonathan Epstein, MD, FCAP, Director, Surgical Pathology at the Johns Hopkins Hospital; Professor, Departments of Pathology, Urology, & Oncology and Reinhard Professor of Urologic Pathology at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine. Dr. Epstein completed a six-year combined Liberal Arts and Medical Education Program at Boston University, completed a fellowship in Pathology at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center in New York, and was Chief Resident, Pathology, at Johns Hopkins. Dr. Epstein's numerous honors include the American Cancer Society's Clinical Oncology Career Development Award, the Johns Hopkins Hospital Departments of Pathology and Urology Faculty Teaching Awards, the Arthur Purdy Stout Society of Surgical Pathologists Award, the Koss Medal for Advancement of Urological Pathology from the International Society of Urological Pathology, and the International Society of Urological Pathology's Grawitz medal.

| OBJECTIVES |

At the conclusion of this educational activity participants should be able to:

- Review the latest information on the diagnosis and prognostic grading of tumors of various genitourinary organs.
- Assess the diagnostic criteria and differential diagnosis of precancerous and cancerous conditions of various organs of the genitourinary system.
- Review the ancillary diagnostic tests for some of these cancers and the reimbursement policies for these tests.
- Develop realistic expectations about reimbursement for diagnostic and prognostic tests for genitourinary cancers.
- Assess important administrative, financial, legislative and legal issues pertaining to the practice of pathology.
- Describe the organizational structure of accountable care organizations.
- Discuss the possible expansion of the role of pathologists' assistants.
