The AACE 23rd Annual Scientific and Clinical Congress in Las Vegas will be a meeting unlike any endocrinology meeting you have ever attended. Your Program Committee that I am honored to chair, along with Drs.

Daniel Hurley, Sandra Weber and 26 other tireless volunteers, have been hard at work since the Phoenix meeting in May 2013 to make certain that your educational and entertainment needs are met and exceeded by this once in a lifetime experience in the Nevada desert. Our objective is to serve the needs of our expanding endocrinology physician base, which is represented by an increasing number of females, international members, and those in alternate practice environments. We have also attempted to offer a program that will appeal to our collaborative partners in the cardiometabolic and endocrine surgery fields. In addition, in cooperation with the Nevada AACE Chapter, we are offering a Primary Care Day on Sunday to cultivate and enhance our ongoing relationships with primary care physicians and mid-level nurse practitioners and physicians' assistants.

The special Pre-Program sessions begin on **WEDNESDAY, MAY 14, 2014**, with eight paid 3.5 hour offerings, four in the morning and four in the afternoon, featuring hot topics such Clinical Pearls in Adrenal Disorders, Diabetes Technology, Fertility and Pregnancy, Bariatric Endocrinology, Maintenance of Certification, Contemporary Metabolic Bone Disease, Re-Thinking Diabetes Care 2014 and Creating a New Business Model for Endocrinology. Paid programs are offered at the vastly discounted rate of \$80 per session. The Wednesday Pre-Program offers members from around the world an opportunity to get settled into Las Vegas early and to supplement their educational experience with focused interactive updates in areas that are difficult to cover adequately within the context of the actual Congress program.

On **THURSDAY, MAY 15**, our opening plenaries feature world famous cardiologist Dr. Valentin Fuster of the Icahn School of Medicine in New York City addressing newly recognized endocrine/metabolic aspects of coronary artery disease, an Endocrine President's Panel featuring leadership from the four major endocrine societies discussing the future of endocrinology, the ever-popular Dr. Jay Skyler from the University of Miami reporting on therapeutic interventions in prediabetes, and trail-blazer Dr. John Eng of Stanford University recounting the discovery and market journey of Exendin-4 and Exenatide.

Women in endocrinology should particularly enjoy the "Developing Women Leaders in AACE" lunch on **THURSDAY** from 12:30-2:15 pm moderated by Dr. Etie Moghissi. In addition, Dr. William Zoghbi from the American College of Cardiology and our own Past President Dr. Yehuda Handelsman will co-chair a fascinating **FRIDAY** In-depth symposium from 2:15-5:00 pm on "Cardiovascular Disease in Women." Moreover, we are privileged to have Dr. JoAnn Manson from Harvard University delivering a plenary Saturday morning on her latest insights regarding the Women's Health Initiative database and estrogen replacement

after menopause. In addition, she will conduct a **SATURDAY** afternoon Meet-the-Expert session on practical uses of ERT.

Our domestic and international Spanish-speaking colleagues will certainly wish to attend Dr. Larissa Aviles-Santa's, National Institute of Health workshop on Diabetabolism in Latinos on **THURSDAY** from 4:45-5:45 pm as well as the popular AACE/SMNE jointly sponsored Pan American Symposium **FRIDAY** from 2:15-5:00 pm where internationally acclaimed Spanish-speaking experts on diabetes and obesity will address contemporary obesity management from a life style, pharmaceutical and surgical standpoint.

As a primer for our joint AACE and American Association of Endocrine Surgeons (AAES) meeting in Nashville in 2015, we have also designed a Las Vegas sub-program to appeal to those who evaluate, image and operate on patients with surgical endocrine disease. After a brief personal account by Tony Harnell of rock band TNT fame, Dr. Greg Randolph from Harvard University will discuss "Maximal Vocal Preservation in Thyroidectomy Patients" in a mini-plenary on **FRIDAY** at 11:00 am. On **SATURDAY**, the endocrine surgery journey will continue with a tribute to Dr. Ernie Mazzaferri by Dr. Ian Hay of the Mayo Clinic and culminate with an afternoon symposium entitled "Integrative Concepts in Endocrinology and Endocrine Surgery: A Tale of Two Cities" moderated by Dr. Nancy Perrier of the MD Anderson Cancer Center in Houston. Sunday morning's second plenary will feature Dr. Raj Kumar from the Mayo Clinic, who will address "Medical and Surgical Management of Hyperparathyroidism in Renal Failure."

Finally, the Program Committee has chosen to innovate the Exhibit Hall as well, with a re-introduction of the Product Theaters that were so successful in Phoenix and the creation of a brand new offering called "The AACE Technology Expo." The Expo will be housed in a large tent in the center of the Exhibit Hall and set up to showcase the "Interventional Thyroidology Practice of the 21st Century" with real life AACE ECNU endocrinologists demonstrating technologic innovations in thyroid and parathyroid care using real life patients. New clinical presentation technologies will also be used within this teaching environment. Fifteen minute ticketed demonstrations will be offered during Exhibit Hall breaks on **THURSDAY, FRIDAY** and **SATURDAY**.

Your 2014 Program Committee has spent countless hours creating a Las Vegas offering that has literally transformed previous approaches from soup to nuts. I have mentioned only a few highlights here to pique your interest, so please realize that many surprises await you in the Nevada desert. Come join us for an AACE event in Vegas that you will never forget. Please plan to bring the family with you, as AACE will have day trips and adventures for them as well. Stay tuned.

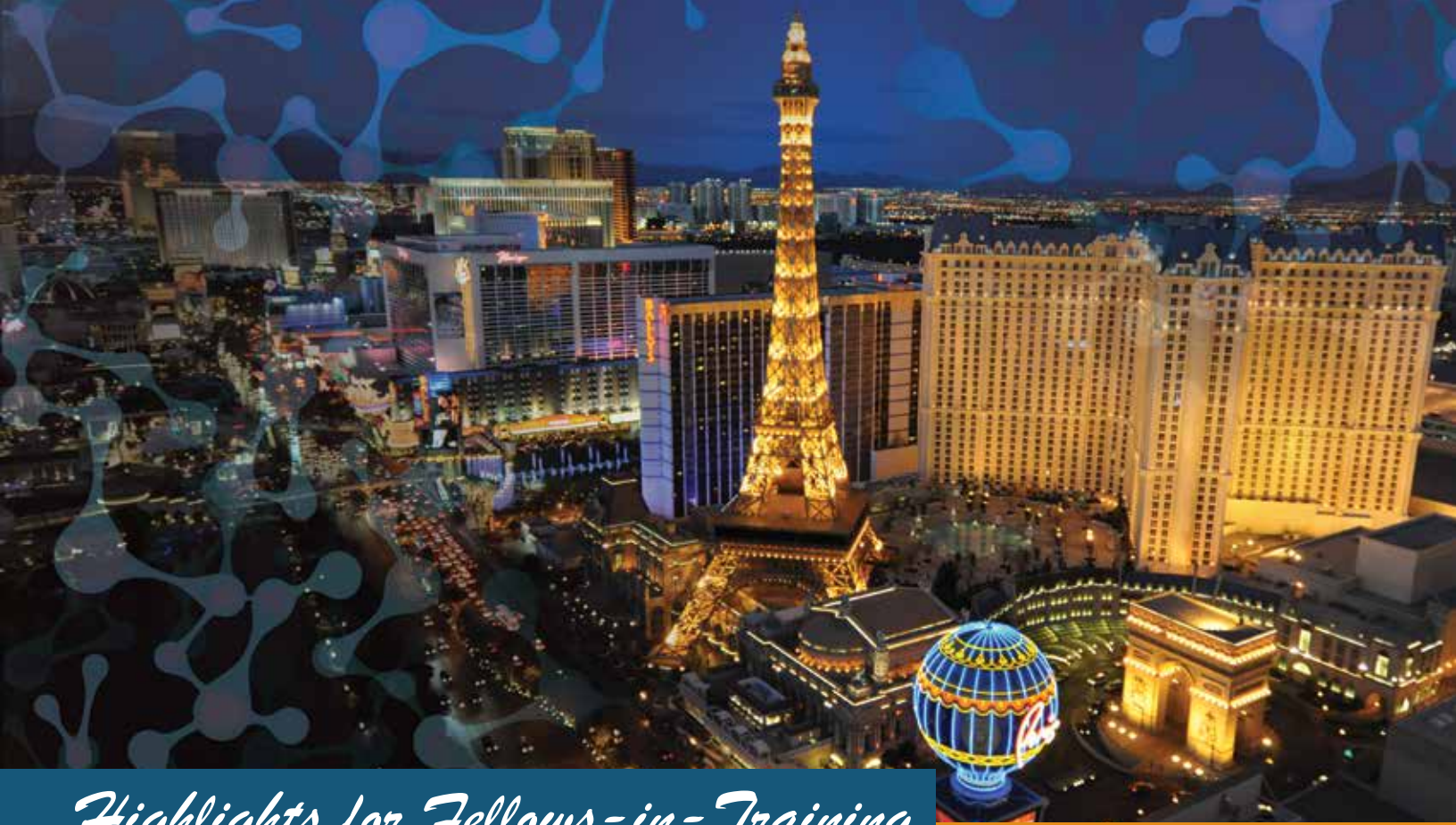
PRESIDENT'S GALA

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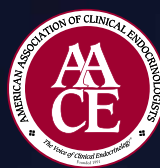
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
