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ABOUT US

The Society for Investigative Dermatology was born out of a vision to serve a segment of science previously unrepresented by the medical societies of the United States: Investigative Dermatology. The founders saw a need for an organization with a devotion to cutaneous investigation, rather than clinical work, and to promote investigative dermatology to a fully respected position among the medical specialties. In tandem with the establishment of the society, they sought to develop a new scientific journal that would act as a singular resource for investigative work in cutaneous biology. Previously, this research had been scattered among the non-dermatology journals and had largely been completed outside the specialty of investigative dermatology. This vision was realized when the SID was founded, bylaws were adopted and a board of nine directors was appointed on June 10, 1937 at the Hotel Dennis in Atlantic City, New Jersey. The Journal of Investigative Dermatology (JID) was launched, with Marion B. Sulzberger as its first editor, and the first Annual Meeting was held in April 1938 in New York City.

EUGENE M. FARBER LECTURE

Psoriasis: Getting to the Heart of the Matter

Joel M. Gelfand, MD
University of Pennsylvania
Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

Dr. Gelfand's research program focuses on observational and interventional trials in patients with psoriasis, a chronic, immune mediated disease of the skin and joints. He has established large population-based and multi-centered clinic based cohorts of patients with psoriasis which are the focus of longitudinal studies evaluating cardiovascular risk and the comparative effectiveness of treatment modalities in this population. Dr. Gelfand has extensive experience in the design and execution of clinical trials and has established collaborations with investigators in translational medicine, nuclear medicine, oncology, cardiology, rheumatology, epidemiology, and biostatistics necessary for the success of multi-disciplinary studies. He has extensive experience mentoring pre- and post-doctoral fellows and candidates in the Master of Science in Epidemiology Program and junior faculty at PENN and institutions across the United States. Dr. Gelfand has protected time to mentor clinical scientists through his K24 award from NIAMS.



NAOMI M. KANOF LECTURE

Integrating Omics-Data for Understanding Complex Disease

Mark R. Chance, PhD
Case Western Reserve University

Dr. Chance is an internationally recognized expert in proteomics and structural biology with over 240 publications (H-index of 50) who has built multiple internationally recognized science and training programs over a 25-year career in academia. Currently, he is Director of the Center for Proteomics and Bioinformatics (CPB) at Case Western Reserve University (CWRU). The faculty, staff and users of the CPB, including its structural biology facilities at Brookhaven National Laboratories, currently publish 200 papers per year using technologies ranging from next generation sequencing to mass spectrometry to crystallography and in fields from cancer to infectious disease to vision research. Dr. Chance has been a leader in clinical and translational research within the Center for Translational Science Collaborative and the Case Comprehensive Cancer Center. His areas of interest include providing leadership as both a scientist and administrator to accelerate the development and translation of biomarkers and treatments for complex diseases.

Dr. Hoekstra is currently the Professor of Organismic and Evolutionary Biology and of Molecular and Cellular Biology at Harvard. Her area of interest resides in the molecular basis of evolutionary change – from morphology to behavior – using wild mice as a study system. Her work spans a diverse array of fields including ecology, evolution, genomics, development, behavior and neurobiology. Research in Dr. Hoekstra's lab is known for its highly integrative approach.



WILLIAM MONTAGNA LECTURE

TGFbeta-signaling in Skin Homeostasis, Diseases and Cancer: Paradoxes and Broken Dogmas

Xiao-Jing Wang, MD/PhD

Dr. Wang's laboratory has developed the first genetically engineered mouse model that develops HNSCC with full penetrance. These lesions mimic human HNSCC at genetic and pathology levels. Research in the Wang laboratory includes: 1) Identification of biomarkers for diagnosis and therapy for human head and neck cancer, 2) Development of animal models for head and neck cancer, 3) Molecular mechanisms of head & neck cancer including the properties of cancer stem cells, transcriptional machinery and microRNA functions, and 4) Experimental therapeutics of head and neck cancer.



JULIUS STONE LECTURE

Role of Prostaglandins in Skin Cancer

Alice P. Pentland, MD

Dr. Pentland's research interest has been in understanding photocarcinogenesis, with areas of focus in photobiology, arachidonic acid metabolism, keratinocyte biology, and their translation into dermatological clinical research. She possesses deep expertise in the design and execution of bench research, and strong expertise in the design and execution of clinical trials. As Professor and Chair of Dermatology, Dr. Pentland is also an active clinical dermatologist. Highly collaborative in research activities, she has generated long- term funded collaborative relationships at the University of Rochester with other clinical and basic research departments, as well as with investigators in computer science, optics and engineering.

Jouni Uitto, MD, PhD, has been Professor of Dermatology and Cutaneous Biology, and Biochemistry and Molecular Biology, and Chair of the Department of Dermatology and Cutaneous Biology at Jefferson Medical College, in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania, since 1986. He is also Director of the Jefferson Institute of Molecular Medicine at Thomas Jefferson University. He received his MD and PhD degrees from the University of Helsinki, Finland, and completed his residency training in dermatology at Washington University School of Medicine in St. Louis, Missouri. Dr. Uitto is internationally recognized for his research on connective tissue biology and molecular genetics in relation to cutaneous diseases.

Epigenetic Mechanisms Controlling Epidermal Development and Differentiation

Dr. Botchkarev's research focuses on delineation of epigenetic mechanisms that control skin development, regeneration and carcinogenesis. Epigenetic regulation is a driving force of tissue development, phenotypic plasticity and evolutionary adaptation. Dr. Botchkarev's research is focused on understanding how signaling/transcription factor and epigenetic regulatory mechanisms are integrated in the control of lineage-specific differentiation programs in healthy and diseased skin.



PLENARY LECTURE #4

Calcium and the Endoplasmic Reticulum in Keratinocyte Differentiation

Theodora M. Mauro, MD

Dr. Mauro's clinical programs have encompassed general inpatient and outpatient medical dermatology, skin cancer treatment in the SFVAMC skin cancer surgery clinic, and wound healing in the UCSF clinic that specializes in treating leg ulcers. Her research interests include calcium, ion channels, keratinocyte, epidermis, non-melanoma skin cancer, SPCA1, SERCA1, Hailey-Hailey Disease, Darier Disease, NHE1, epidermal barrier, stratum corneum, aging and wound healing. As Service Chief and Vice-Chairman, Dr. Mauro has supervised the development of the SFVAMC Dermatology Service which has been named a regional referral center for Mohs surgery. The SFVAMC Dermatology Service has developed a regional teledermatology service that handles dermatology consults from Eureka, Ukiah, Reno and Hawaii.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

Only one paper or poster may be read or presented by the same author at the Meeting, although a presenter may be a co-author of any number of papers. The material must not have been published prior to submission of the abstract or presented at any national meeting prior to the date of presentation at the SID Annual Meeting. Simultaneous submission of the same abstract to other meetings is prohibited.

PUBLICATION OF ABSTRACTS

All abstracts will be published on the Abstract Central website on or around April 15, 2014 and in the May 2014 issue of the Journal of Investigative Dermatology (JID), scheduled for print publication by April 15, 2014.

Abstracts will also be available via JID advance online publication in mid-March. Abstract acceptance letters will be sent via email in mid-February. Meeting Programs will be available online in early April 2014 as well as on-site at the meeting.

ABSTRACT FEE AND AUTHOR INFORMATION

The publication/processing fee is \$50 US and must be paid via the internet at the time of submission.

PRESENTATION

The SID Committee on Scientific Programs reviews all abstracts without knowing the identity of authors. All abstracts, including those selected for oral presentation, must be presented as posters. Further information regarding submission of abstracts can be found on the online submission website <http://sid2014.abstractcentral.com>.

Notes about 2014 abstracts

- Unless indicated by initiating an opt-out, all abstract submissions to the 2014 Meeting will be considered for Oral Presentation.
- Submitters must choose both a primary category for their abstract, as well as a secondary category. Doing so will help the Scientific Program Committee have the flexibility (if needed) to put together the best possible meeting program.
- Again in 2014, the SID will have an electronic poster viewing system available as a companion piece to physical posters. Updates will be posted as they become available on the SID website.

TRAVEL FELLOWSHIP AWARDS

The Albert M. Kligman Fellowship Fund was established in 1995 to support young investigators traveling to the SID's Annual Meeting to present scientific work. In the past, fifteen to twenty awards have been made each year.

2014 ABSTRACT CATEGORIES AND DEFINITIONS

ADAPTIVE IMMUNITY

Studies of adaptive immune responses involving T and B lymphocytes, antigen presenting cells, dendritic cells and antigen processing/presentation.

AUTO-IMMUNITY & INFLAMMATION

Studies of clinical disease states involving autoimmunity or abnormal skin inflammation.

CARCINOGENESIS AND CANCER GENETICS

Studies on the development, maintenance and metastasis of cancer as well as the genetic basis of skin cancer.

CUTANEOUS AND HAIR DEVELOPMENT

Studies on the hair follicle, sebaceous gland and other skin appendages; developmental biology of skin and hair, including studies of the role of stem cells in normal development.

EPIDEMIOLOGY & HEALTH SERVICES RESEARCH

Studies, typically observational, involving the evaluation of health or disease with respect to the skin in populations.

EPIDERMAL STRUCTURE & BARRIER FUNCTION

Studies examining any cellular component of the epidermis that influences keratinocyte proliferation, terminal differentiation and/or barrier function.

GENETIC DISEASES/GENE REGULATION/GENE THERAPY

Studies on cutaneous gene expression, genetically-based diseases and their treatment, including gene therapy. Cancer-related genetic studies are more appropriate for "Carcinogenesis, Growth Factors, and Cancer Genetics."

GROWTH FACTORS, CELL ADHESION AND MATRIX BIOLOGY

Studies on growth factors and the interactions of cells with their local cellular and extracellular environment that affect signaling, adhesion, migration and development.

HUMAN CLINICAL RESEARCH AND THERAPEUTICS

Studies involving human subjects and not preclinical animal model studies. Experimental studies submitted to this category that do not involve human subjects will be moved to a more appropriate category by Abstract Reviewers.

INNATE IMMUNITY & MICROBIOLOGY

Studies of innate immunity, including cells, receptors and effector molecules of the innate immune response. Studies on skin microbes and infectious processes of the skin.

PHOTOBIOLOGY

Studies on biological, biochemical and molecular responses to ultraviolet radiation in cultured cells or animals.

PIGMENTATION & MELANOMA

Studies on all aspects of cutaneous or extracutaneous pigmentation; and molecular, cellular, and biological facets of melanoma. Genetic studies on melanoma should be considered for the category "Carcinogenesis and Cancer Genetics".

TISSUE REGENERATION AND WOUND HEALING

Wound healing and regeneration studies and studies that involve processes/signaling that affect vascular development and angiogenesis.

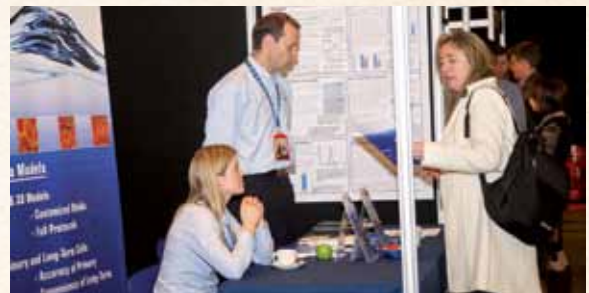

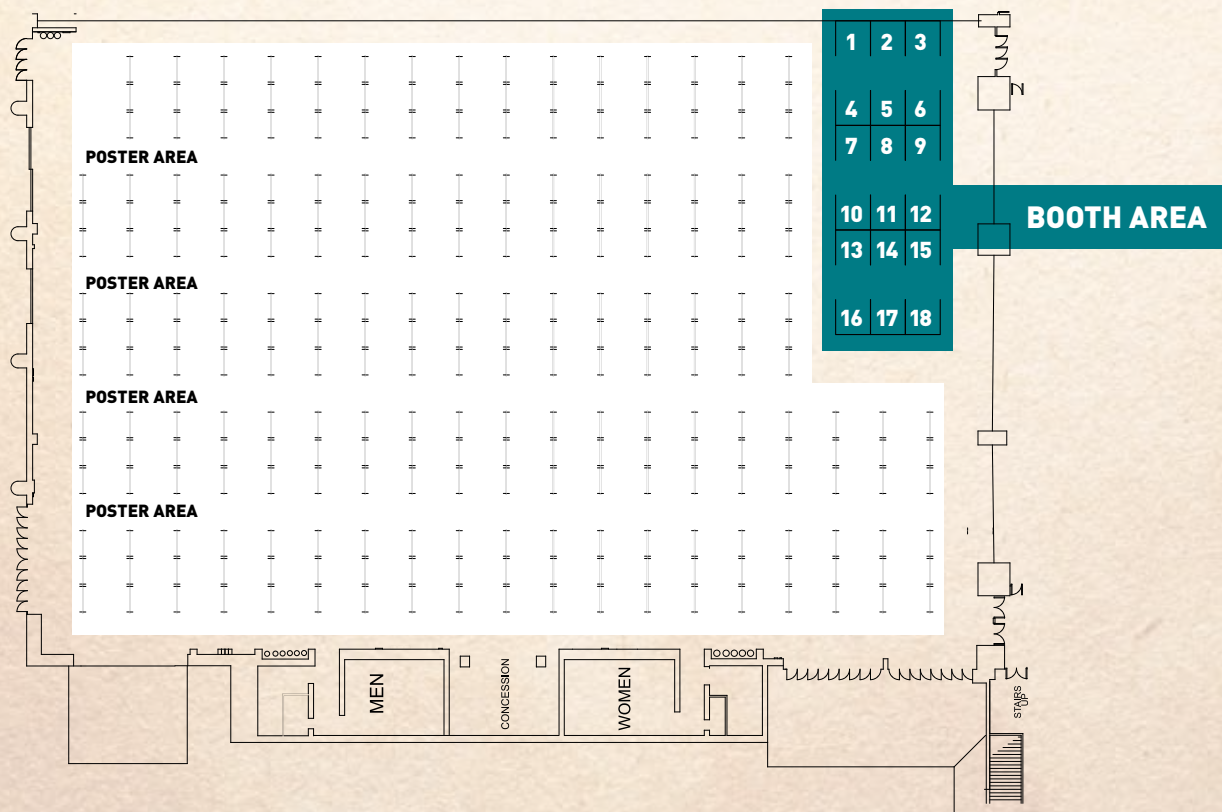

Society Management reserves the sole right to render all interpretations, amend and enforce these regulations and to establish any and all further regulations not specifically covered below to assure the general success and well-being of the show. Each exhibitor agrees to abide by these regulations and by any amendments or additions hereafter made by Society Management. The SID's Annual Meeting serves as a forum for leaders of the dermatologic and medical industry to exchange the latest product information available in a professional atmosphere. SID Management reserves the right to decline, prohibit, deny access or remove any exhibit which in its sole judgment is contrary to the character, objectives, and best interests of the Show or suitable for its attendee audience. This reservation includes, but is not limited to, any violation of any public policy or these rules and regulations and extends to persons, things, printed matter, products and conduct.

SID Management's decision and interpretation shall be accepted as final in all cases.

1. **VALID CONTRACT FOR SPACE:** Applications for exhibit space are required to execute and forward the Exhibit Space Contract to SID's Annual Meeting. To be valid, each contract must convey a minimum deposit of 50% of the total amount with 100% on contracts received on and after January 1, 2014.
2. **SPACE ASSIGNMENT:** Booth spaces will be available on a first-come, first-served basis. Assignments will be based on the date contracts are received and placement of the most suitable booth preference. Show management reserves the right to reposition booths based on abstract layout.
3. **PAYMENT OF SPACE:** A minimum of 50% of the total fee for the space requested must accompany the Exhibit Space Contract. The remainder must be paid in full within 30 days of receipt of the first invoice. There will be a \$25.00 charge on all returned checks. Contracts received on and after January 1, 2014 must include full payment.

Any deviations from this provision, including but not limited to acceptance by Show Management of any late payments specified herein, shall not be construed as a waiver of Show Management's rights to cancel exhibitor's contract for such non-compliance, re-assign booth location, take possession of said space without refund or further notification, or otherwise be construed as a modification of any schedule of payments required hereunder. Further, all payments as stated hereunder shall be payable at Show Management's principal place of business as stated in this contract.

Sharing space with individuals or companies not officially represented by the contracting exhibitor is strictly prohibited and may result in eviction.

6. **OPERATION OF EXHIBITS:**
 - a. **Selling:** Exhibitors may display, provide samples, discuss, explain and demonstrate products or services, but may not make any sales which result in the direct exchange of monies or the use of credit cards in the exhibit hall. However, exhibitors may take orders for products/services for future delivery.
 - b. **Raffles, Lotteries:** No exhibitor may sponsor or conduct any raffles, lotteries or games of chance.
 - c. **Noise and Sound:** Musical instruments, audio equipment, and other noise-making devices or amplifying equipment shall be operated only at a level which will not interfere with other exhibitors. SID Management shall be the sole judge of what constitutes appropriate sound levels.
 - d. **Music Licensing:** Any tenant using copyrighted music during the SID's Annual Meeting, whether within the exhibit area, in hospitality space or in any other way related to the SID's Annual Meeting, shall obtain permission for such use from SID Management. This applies to all live and recorded music, including accompanying video or other presentations. Any exhibitor using copyrighted music assumes the entire responsibility for its use and for obtaining the appropriate permission and payment of any fees associated with its use. No materials can be accepted at the exhibit hall prior to 8:00 a.m., Wednesday, May 7, 2014, at which time installation will begin. All installation must be completed for final inspection by 5:00 p.m., Wednesday, May 7, 2014.

Any space not claimed or occupied by 5:00 p.m. on Wednesday, May 7, 2014 may be resold or reassigned by SID Management without notification or any obligation on the part of SID Management or any refund or compensation whatsoever.

Unattended freight in any display space as of one hour prior to the show opening on Thursday, May 8, 2014 will be removed and stored at the exhibitor's sole risk and expense.
