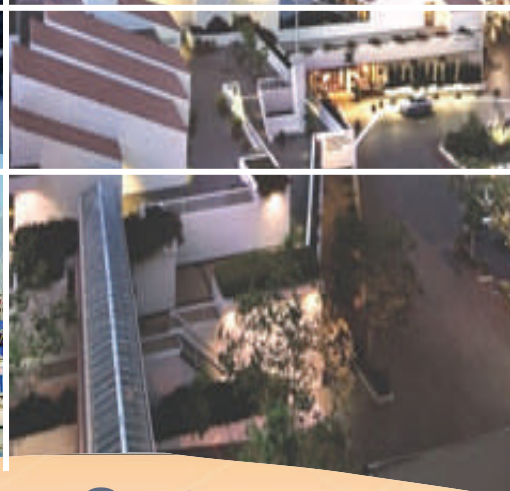

With a theme of "**Evolution and Change**," the meeting features national and regional experts on practical topics that are fundamental to an efficient orthopaedic practice. **Mike McCaslin**, the orthopaedic numbers expert, will update attendees on the latest trends in orthopaedic practice. We are also fortunate to have **Karen Zupko** discussing how to document and code using ICD-10.

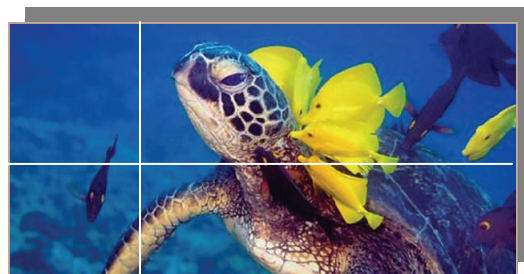
