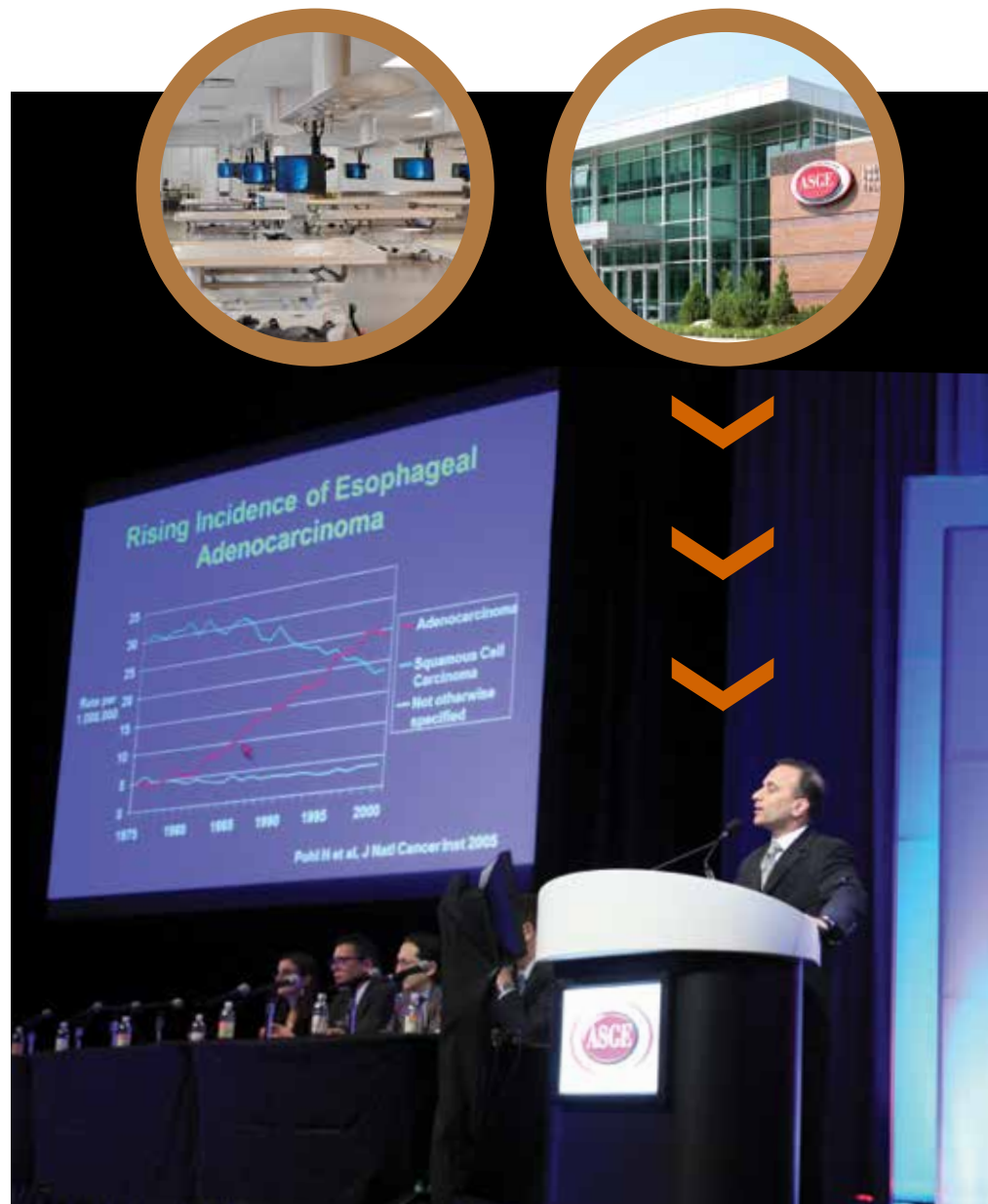
Learning Objectives

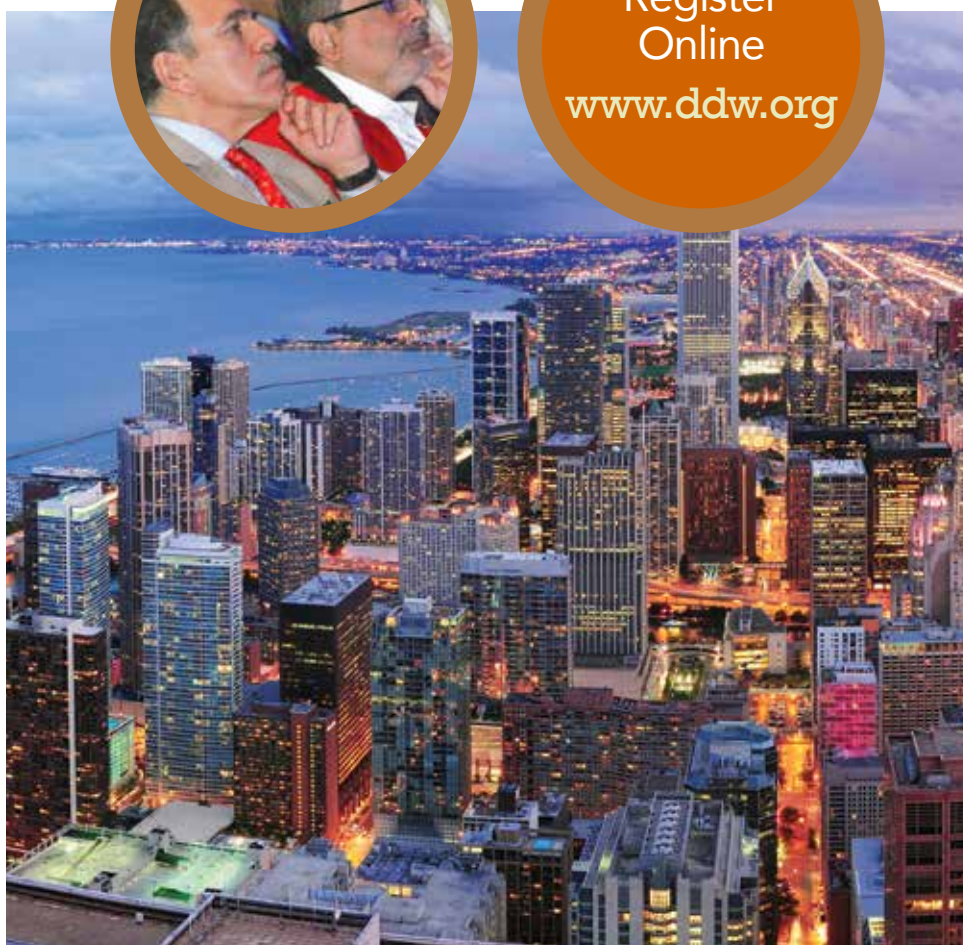
