ASGE/AASLD Endoscopy in Liver Disease: Radiologists, Hepatologists, and Endoscopists

Course Description

This course is designed to improve endoscopic practice using a three-pronged approach to learning including didactic lectures, video demonstrations and hands-on training sessions under the tutelage of expert endoscopists at the ASGE Institute for Training and Technology. The goal is to help endoscopists enhance the quality of their practice with the latest science and technology in the endoscopic management of the manifestations and complications of acute and chronic liver disease and associated diseases.

Learning Objectives

Upon completion of this educational activity, participants will be able to:

- Discuss appropriate use of prophylactic antibiotics in patients with chronic liver disease presenting with acute bleeding, and those with biliary disease undergoing ERCP
- Apply the physiologic considerations of advanced liver disease in managing sedation and analgesia for performance of endoscopy in these patients
- Describe selection of appropriate testing and therapies in patients with upper GI bleeding in the setting of chronic liver disease
- Demonstrate the technical use of various endoscopic and non-endoscopic devices to arrest acute variceal bleeding, including band ligating devices and variceal tamponade balloon catheters
- Identify the utility of cyanoacrylate glue injection for the treatment of gastric varices
- Discuss the selection and application of plastic and metal biliary stents for malignant and benign biliary disease.
- Describe appropriate selection and means of application of radiofrequency ablation (RFA) and photodynamic therapy (PDT) in the treatment of cholangiocarcinoma
