Is This Educational Activity Right For Me?

The ASCCP High Resolution Anoscopy (HRA) course best serves those physicians and advanced practice clinicians who are participating in the health care of MSM, men and women with HIV disease, other at-risk groups, and women with HPV-related disease. This course is appropriate for health care providers in many fields, including family practice, internal medicine and infectious disease, gastroenterology, general surgery, colo-rectal surgery, gynecology and pathology. Advanced colposcopy practitioners and those interested in the didactic and procedural training specific to HPV-related anal disease and HRA will benefit from this course. The HRA course is designed for those who have basic proficiency in the practice of colposcopy. Documentation of prior completion of an ACCME-accredited comprehensive/ basic colposcopy training such as the ASCCP Comprehensive Colposcopy course or statement of current active colposcopy practice or colposcopy training from an accredited US residency program is also acceptable. The faculty of the HRA course strongly recommends that anyone having no or limited prior colposcopy experience attend the first 1.5 days of the Comprehensive Colposcopy course and the special non-CME workshop on the basics of How to Use a Colposcope given immediately prior to the beginning of each HRA course. All attendees are encouraged to attend the non-CME workshop.

Course Competencies and Objectives

This course has been designed to improve competencies in medical knowledge, practice-based learning, systems-based practice, and patient care. Upon completion of this educational activity and its post-test and evaluation tool, the learner should be able to:

- Describe the epidemiology and pathology of anal HPV infection, Anal Intraepithelial Neoplasia (AIN), and anal cancer (medical knowledge);
- Identify patients who may benefit from anal cancer screening (practice-based learning, patient care);
- Demonstrate the diagnostic procedures used in the evaluation of AIN and anal cancer including anal cytology, high resolution anoscopy, and anal biopsy (practice-based learning, patient care);

- Describe and apply the appropriate treatment and management options for AIN and anal cancer (medical knowledge, practice-based learning, patient care); and,
- Describe and apply prevention options for AIN and anal cancer (medical knowledge, practice-based learning, patient care).

Course Educational Methods

Lectures: The learners will attend general sessions consisting of didactic lectures covering the basic principles considered the foundation of knowledge required to evaluate, diagnose and manage HPV-related anal disease. Throughout the lectures and question and answer periods, faculty members utilize an Audience Response System. The Faculty uses these group responses to readdress items not answered correctly by the target goal percentage. This immediate feedback helps course attendees identify their own weaknesses and allows them to follow up with the faculty onsite.

Open Question and Answer Sessions: Each lecture session concludes with an open question and answer period led by the presenter(s). Questions are solicited from the learners and are read to the full audience. In addition, educators seek teaching opportunities at breaks to answer specific questions one on one.

Pattern Recognition/Case Presentation: These break-out sessions provide an intense and interactive exposure in a small group format to multiple HRA images as well as anal cytology and histology. Numerous images are presented during the span of a given course, allowing learners to practice assessing for presence or absence of disease, evaluating abnormalities, and planning treatment options. In addition, the case study sessions are designed for sharpening learners' HRA pattern recognition skills, improving their ability in differentiating normal from abnormal conditions, and improving their differentiation skills of low grade lesions versus high grade lesions and cancer, and management issues.

Hands-on Sessions: Non-CME sessions on the techniques and procedures used in high resolution anoscopy, including biopsy techniques and treatment modalities are provided. These sessions utilize latex models to practice HRA and the identification of lesions and non-human tissue to practice biopsy and infra-red coagulation techniques. Under the direct supervision of faculty, participants practice in structured simulations to perform these techniques.

Video Session: A video session on the HRA procedure and infra-red coagulation (a treatment modality) is presented. A faculty member provides orientation and commentary during the video.

Reinforcement Tools: Prior to the course, participants receive access to full color screen sized images of the presentation slides through the ASCCP lecture download webpage. Attendees may download the lectures prior to the course and bring their laptop in order to access the slides during the course.
