About the Speaker

Illegal street drugs are as popular as ever! With the evolution of chemical drugs it's an important time for all health care practitioners to be aware of what is being used by your patients. This lecture course is intended to assist health care professionals in identifying and managing the substance abuse patient.

Harold L. Crossley, D.D.S., M.S., Ph.D., is Professor Emeritus at the University of Maryland Dental School. A native of Rhode Island, Dr. Crossley received a Bachelor of Science degree in Pharmacy from the University of Rhode Island in 1964. He was later awarded the Master of Science (1970) and Doctorate degrees (1972) in Pharmacology. The University of Maryland Dental School in Baltimore awarded Dr. Crossley the DDS degree in 1980. Dr. Crossley has co-authored a number of articles and four books dealing with a variety of topics within the field of pharmacology. Drawing on a unique background, Dr. Crossley has become nationally and internationally recognized as an expert on street drugs and chemical dependency as well as the clinical pharmacology of dental drugs.
