COURSE DESCRIPTION: The Society for Airway Management (SAM) is comprised of a multidisciplinary group of physicians from Anesthesiology, Emergency Medicine, Otolaryngology, Critical Care, and Pulmonology Medicine, as well as CRNAs, paramedics and nurses. The **18th SAM Annual Scientific Meeting and Workshop** has been developed to feature international experts in the various fields of medicine involving with airway management. Many aspects of difficult airway management, in a variety of clinical settings, will be highlighted. This course will consist of plenary presentations, small group round table discussions, a Hands-On Workshop including a Patient Simulator Session, and Professor Poster Rounds. Audience engagement will be encouraged with question periods and an audience response system. There are Abstract Scientific Exhibit sessions, oral presentations of selected abstracts and opportunities to interact with product developers, manufacturers and distributors.

The theme of this year's meeting is looking back at major changes with regards to airway management in the last quarter of century and a looking forward to what the future holds.

COURSE OBJECTIVES: At the conclusion of the conference, the participant will be able to:

1. Describe advances in airway management devices in the past 25 years.
2. Define new challenges and apply lessons learned with regards to the ASA Closed Claims Project.
3. Discuss new challenges with regards to airway management outside the operating room.
4. Recognize the latest guidelines with regards to OSA.
5. Describe strengths and weaknesses of algorithmic airway approach.
6. Demonstrate current controversies with regards to extubation.
7. Outline steps to establish training and define competency in airway management.

Target Audience: Anesthesiologists, emergency medicine physicians, otolaryngologists, intensivists, trauma surgeons, paramedics, certified nurse anesthetists, flight nurses, trainees and all other allied health professionals assisting with airway management should attend.

Call for Abstracts: Be a part of one of the most rewarding sections of the annual meeting. Plan to submit your abstract for consideration for poster presentation. In addition, a select group of abstracts will be nominated for oral presentation during the meeting. The top three abstracts will be awarded a SAM certificate in recognition for their outstanding contribution to the meeting and the advancement of airway management.

Trainee Awards: We particularly encourage residents-fellows in training to submit their scientific works. A select number of resident abstracts will be awarded a cash stipend of \$500. Award winners will also receive free meeting registration. The trainee must be first author and presenting author of the accepted abstract. A letter from the Program Director confirming the resident is in good standing in their training program must accompany their submission.

Submission details:

1. 250 words maximum excluding title, authors, tables, figures or pictures. *Abstracts will be truncated at 250 words and evaluated only on what is contained therein.*
2. Word document format, (Times New Roman, size 12 preferred).
3. Presenting author's name in bold, name of institution, conflicts of interest and IRB approval should be disclosed, financial support should be acknowledged.
4. Deadline is June 15, 2014.
5. Presenter will be notified via email.
6. Submit abstract online via the SAM website at: <http://samhq.com/new-sam-abstract-submission-form/>. Confirmation of receipt will be sent within 7 days.

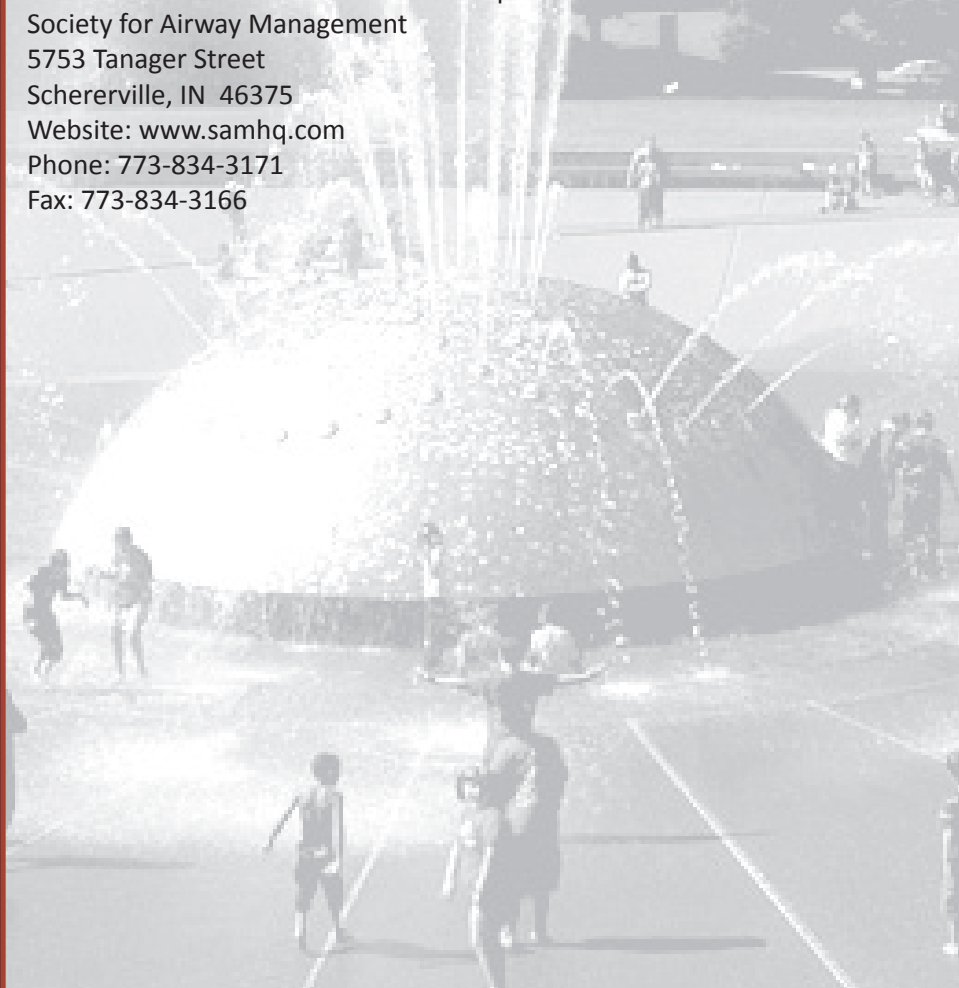

Airway on Demand (AOD) is an A-to-Z update of the current trends in clinical airway management designed for the practicing anesthesiologist. The course will cover topics such as the new ASA difficult airway guidelines, advanced airway evaluation, pediatric airway management, awake intubation, new video laryngoscopes, the role of new supraglottic airways in difficult airway management, invasive airway access and difficult extubation. AOD is being offered to the clinician who wants a solid review of the current devices and techniques, before attending SAM, where more advanced ideas are shared.

Educational Objectives:

Participants who attend this course will be able to:

1. Develop an appropriate airway management plan based on the findings of a focused medical history and airway physical exam, and apply these plans to patient care.
 2. Apply principles of advanced airway evaluation to the synthesis of an appropriate airway plan.
 3. Assess their plan of airway rescue and routine tracheal intubation with the incorporation of modern supraglottic airways.
 4. Assess their plan of airway rescue and routine airway management with the incorporation of modern supraglottic airways.
 5. Apply patient preparation techniques in the performance of awake tracheal intubation.
 6. Apply techniques of minimally invasive airway rescue.
 7. Evaluate the potential for failed tracheal extubation and develop a plan for emergency reintubation.
- *All participants must register for the SAM conference prior to course acceptance.*
