James C. Kulild, DDS, MS (USA)

Dr. Kulild earned a DDS from the University of Missouri-Kansas City, School of Dentistry in 1973 and a Master of Science in Oral Biology from The George Washington University, Washington, D.C. He earned a certificate in Endodontics from Walter Reed Army Medical Center, Washington, D.C. He is a Diplomate, American Board of Endodontics, and Immediate Past President, American Association of Endodontists. He is a Fellow of both the American and the International College of Dentists. Dr. Kulild recently retired after eleven years as a tenured Professor and Director, Advanced Specialty Education Program in Endodontics at the UMKC, School of Dentistry. Upon his retirement, he was granted Professor Emeritus status based on his significant contributions to the University. He spent 28 years active duty and retired from the U.S. Army in 2002. Previous Army assignments included Director, U.S. Army Endodontic Residency Program, Fort Gordon, Georgia; Dean and Commandant, Academy of Health Sciences, U.S. Army Medical Department Center and School, Fort Sam, Houston, Texas; Commander, 93D Medical Battalion (Dental Service), Heidelberg, Germany; and deployment to support Operation Joint Guardian as Commander, Task Force Medical Falcon and United States Commanding Officer and NATO Surgeon, Task Force Falcon, Camp Bondsteel, Kosovo in Yugoslavia.

Topic: Aggressive endodontic intervention



C. John Munce, DDS, FICD (USA)

Dr. Munce is a Diplomate of the American Board of Endodontics and Clinical Assistant Professor of Endodontics at both Loma Linda University and the University of Southern California. He is a Fellow of the International College of Dentists and Past President of the California State Association of Endodontists. Dr. Munce received both his training in Endodontics and his dental degree from Loma Linda University. Clinical concepts and techniques originated by Dr. Munce have been published in a number of primary endodontic textbooks, most recently in the 6th edition of Ingle's *Endodontics* and the 9th edition of *Pathways of the Pulp*, and he co-authored a chapter on MTA repair of post perforations in Nadim Baba's recently-released prosthodontics textbook, *Contemporary Restoration of Endodontically Treated Teeth*. Dr. Munce is a frequent international lecturer and, since 1988, has maintained a private endodontic practice in both Santa Barbara and Solvang, California.

Markus Haapasalo, DDS, PhD, Fellow of RCD (endodontics) (CANADA)

Dr. Haapasalo received his dental degree from the Faculty of Dentistry of the University of Helsinki, Finland in 1978. From 1995 to 2004 he was a Professor of Endodontics in Oslo, Norway and from 2004 professor and chair of the Division of Endodontics at UBC, Vancouver, Canada. He is also the head of the Department of Oral Biological and Medical Sciences. Dr. Haapasalo has authored or co-authored over 160 scientific peer reviewed articles. He is the editor-in-chief of "Endodontic Topics", a former associate editor of "Journal of Endodontics", Editorial Board member of "International Endodontic Journal", and editor of "Visual Endodontics 2012" and "Visual Endodontics for iPad" multimedia. In clinical endodontics his areas of special interest include instrumentation, biofilms, irrigation, persistent infections, and resorptions. Dr. Haapasalo has received several teaching awards including the Louis I. Grossman International Award by the French Endodontic Society in 2007 and Teacher of the Year in Canada 2014. He was the keynote speaker of IADR 2013 annual meeting and is actively lecturing about endodontics world-wide.

Stephen P. Niemczyk, DMD (USA)

Dr. Niemczyk graduated from the University Of Pennsylvania School Of Dental Medicine, receiving his DMD in 1982 and his postgraduate Endodontic certificate in 1984. Formerly the Director of Undergraduate and Post-Graduate endodontics at the University of Pennsylvania, Dr. Niemczyk has been the Director of Endodontic Microsurgery at Harvard University in Boston, MA and Albert Einstein Medical Center in Philadelphia since 1995. He also serves as a surgical consultant to the Postgraduate Endodontic Program at the National Naval Medical Center in Bethesda, MD, and the U. S. Army Endodontic Residency Program in Fort Gordon, GA. He is a Diplomate of the American Board of Endodontics, and maintains a full time practice limited to Endodontics in Drexel Hill, PA.

Aviad Tamse, DMD, FICD (ISRAEL)

Dr. Tamse received his DMD degree from the Hebrew University and Hadassah Faculty of Dental Medicine (1969), and his endodontic training from the Harvard School of Dental Medicine Boston (1971-1973). Dr. Tamse was twice President of the Israel Endodontic Society, Chair of the Endodontic Board Examination Committee of the Israel Dental Association Scientific Committee, and a Co-Founder of the European Society of Endodontology in 1982. He has authored and co-authored over 87 scientific articles in peer-reviewed journals and has served on the Editorial Board of the International Endodontic Journal. For many years, his primary research interest has been the vertical root fractures in endodontically treated teeth.

Dr. Tamse was the Chair of the Department of Endodontology (2000 - 2008), School of Dental Medicine at Tel Aviv University, the Director of the Graduate Endodontic Program, and the Chair of the curriculum committee of the dental school.

Stanley F. Malamed, DDS (USA)

Dr. Malamed graduated from the New York University College of Dentistry (1969) and completed a residency in anesthesiology at Montefiore Hospital and Medical Center in the Bronx, New York. He joined the faculty of University of Southern California (1973), where he is Emeritus Professor of Dentistry. Dr. Malamed is a Diplomate of the American Dental Board of Anesthesiology, a recipient of the *Heidebrink Award* (1996) from the American Dental Society of Anesthesiology and the *Horace Wells Award* from the International Federation of Dental Anesthesia Societies (1997). Dr. Malamed has authored more than 150 scientific papers and 17 chapters in various medical and dental journals and textbooks in the areas of physical evaluation, emergency medicine, local anesthesia, sedation and general anesthesia. In addition, Dr. Malamed is the author of three widely used textbooks, published by CV Mosby: *Handbook of Medical Emergencies in the Dental Office* (7th edition 2014); *Handbook of Local Anesthesia* (6th edition 2012); and *Sedation - a guide to patient management* (5th edition 2010) and two interactive DVD's: *Emergency Medicine* (2nd edition, 2008) and *Malamed's Local Anesthetic Technique DVD* (2004) (edition 2 - 2012).

Jean-Yves G. Cochet, DDS (FRANCE)

Dr. Cochet received his DDS from the University of Paris VII in 1984 and his endodontic training from the University of Paris VII in 1990. He has served as a Clinical Assistant Professor at the University of Paris VII from 1986 to 1990, and he was teaching at the post-graduate program of endodontics directed by Dr. J.M Laurichesse from 1990 to 1996. Since 1999 he has been teaching at the Post graduate program of Endodontics of Florida Southeastern University NOVA and nominated as Visiting Professor of Nova Southeastern University College of Dental Medicine in 2008. He served as President of the French Endodontic Society from 1998 to 2000. Dr. Cochet has made numerous international presentations on endodontics, traumatology and endodontic surgery. He currently resides in Paris and his favorite activity other than endodontics includes scuba diving, skiing and spending time with his family.

Topic: Bone preservation and regeneration in endodontic surgery



Bruno Correa de Azevedo, DDS, MS (USA)

Dr. Azevedo received his DDS from Gama Filho University in Brazil in 2000. He then completed a 2 year residency program in Oral and Maxillofacial Radiology at APCD in Bauru, Sao Paulo. In 2004, he managed the first dental imaging lab in Latin America to employ the use of a high resolution, small volume Cone Beam Computer Tomography in his hometown, Brasilia. Seeking a more in-depth understanding of 3D imaging, Dr. Azevedo became a preceptor in 2005 at the University Of Texas Health Science Center at San Antonio, in the Department of Dental Diagnostic Science. In 2006, he was accepted into UTHSCSA's Oral and Maxillofacial Radiology Residency Program. He finished his residency in 2008 and received his Master's Degree in Dental Diagnostic Science in 2009. Bruno became a member of the prestigious American Board of Oral Maxillofacial Radiology in 2010. He has presented at over 30 national and international scientific meetings and has published in a number of national and international dental journals about dental 3D technology. Currently, he is an Assistant Professor at Western University of Health Sciences College of Dental Medicine in Pomona, California, and a consultant in the field of Oral Maxillofacial Radiology.
