About Edinburgh

Alive with inspiration and innovation, Edinburgh was recently voted Britain's most popular tourist destination. Its world-famous international arts festival, The Fringe, explodes on to the streets in August, while all year round a host of other events erupt into life. This is a city of arts and sciences, with theatres, concert halls, art collections, museums and many other institutions of international significance.

Edinburgh's compact city centre also makes it ideally suited for leisurely and informative strolls. With Edinburgh Castle as an easily visible landmark, many of the city's attractions are easy to find and are within walking distance of the conference centre and principal hotels.

HISTORY

Edinburgh Castle dominates the city-centre skyline and from its ramparts are visible medieval lanes and elegant, sweeping Georgian terraces holding over a thousand years of history, mystery and tradition.

Crowned the first City of Literature, Edinburgh is a metropolis built on books, an inspiration for and full of writers, readers and artists. There are very many theatres, which attract a variety of world-renowned events. Days may be spent exploring the city's many museums, while The National Galleries of Scotland operate five main venues in the central city, with admission free to the permanent collections of Scotland

CURRENCY

See www.xe.com for a currency calculator. Scottish banks issue their own notes, which have the same value as those issued by the Bank of England and are legal tender in all parts of the mainland UK.

ELECTRICITY

British electrical standards are 50Hz and 230 volts, so some North American and European electrical devices may require converters, and will require plug adapters.

EMERGENCY SERVICES

The telephone number for emergency services in the UK is 999.

GETTING AROUND EDINBURGH

Edinburgh is easy to explore on foot and the city is often visually stunning. For longer journeys plentiful buses and taxis are always available.

GOVERNMENT

Scotland is part of the UK and plays a full part in its parliamentary democracy. The Scottish Government is based in Edinburgh, with authority over education, law, transport, health and some social services within the country.

The UK is a member of the European Union. Of considerable interest, however, is that a referendum on possible Scottish independence from the UK will take place on September 18th 2014, just after WCCS 2014.



HEALTH

There are no vaccinations required or recommended for entry into the UK. Should there be health concerns, general practitioner medical advice is readily available, while The Royal Infirmary of Edinburgh, a large teaching hospital, is located just 15 minutes south of the city centre.

SMOKING

Since April 2006, there has been a ban on smoking in all enclosed public areas throughout Scotland.

TAX

There is no bed tax but Value Added Tax (VAT) is charged on virtually all purchases in shops, hotels and restaurants at a rate of 20%.

POSSIBLE RECLAIM OF PURCHASE TAX FOR VISITORS

People travelling to Scotland on business may be entitled to reclaim tax charged on event expenses as well as accommodation, business entertaining, meals, transport and more. A company called Tax Back International can assist. See Tax Back International website (opens in new window) or call +353 1 878 3361.

Upon receipt of original invoices, Tax Back International will process refund claims. Terms and Conditions Apply.

SHOPPING AND RESTAURANTS

Edinburgh is fantastic for shoppers, with boutiques on Victoria Street, the Grassmarket (a paradise of independent merchants, designers and artisans) and the world's oldest independent department store, Jenners. Edinburgh has more restaurants per head than any other UK city and a wide range of sophisticated clubs and bars in which to enjoy a traditional Scottish tippie or a freshly mixed cocktail.

THE WEATHER

Edinburgh enjoys a moderate year-round climate, without violent weather extremes. From April to September, temperatures are mild and compare favourably with other European cities, while rainfall is always possible but less annually than in Frankfurt, New York and Rome.

An Edinburgh day often dawns with a clear blue sky, and may be warm and pleasant in summer - but in winter, it is often accompanied by a sharp frost. A choice of warm clothing, a raincoat and an umbrella are always advisable.

TRAVEL TO EDINBURGH

Edinburgh is at the heart of Scotland and easy to reach by air, rail and road.

AIR www.baa.com

Edinburgh Airport is 12km from the city centre with excellent coach and taxi connections. Major airlines fly to over 30 European destinations as well as New York, and over 90 flights per day connect Edinburgh with London's five airports, from which connections radiate worldwide. Direct links to Calgary and Toronto are also provided from Glasgow Airport, an hour's drive away.

There is an excellent taxi service from the airport to the city, with official airport taxis at a taxi rank outside the terminal building, the journey costing about £20 and taking about 20 minutes. Airlink 100 operates a frequent bus service (every 10 minutes at peak times) between Edinburgh Airport and the city centre.

RAIL www.nationalrail.co.uk

The Edinburgh-London route is the fastest train service between cities in Britain, taking just over four hours from one city centre to the other. There are also high-speed links to all other major UK cities and airports, while the Eurostar service connects Paris to Edinburgh in around eight hours.

ROAD www.theaa.com

The Channel Tunnel allows direct access to the UK, where connection is easy with the excellent UK road and motorway network to Edinburgh. A national coach station connects to all major UK cities.

The Scientific Committee invites authors to submit abstracts for consideration for inclusion in the programme. Abstracts will be considered for the award of one of a number of generous educational grants of €1000 each from the European Academy of Dermatology and Venereology (EADV), if indicated where requested on the submission form. **Please note that only electronic submission will be accepted.**

PREPARATION OF YOUR ABSTRACT

1. Abstracts must be submitted in English
2. A blind selection process will be used.
No identifying features such as names of authors, hospitals, medical schools, clinics or cities may be listed in the title or text of the abstract. The names of authors

and their affiliations (institutions) will be registered separately when submitting the abstract online.

3. The abstract material must be original and not have been previously presented or published.
4. The title should be as brief as possible, without abbreviations and sufficient to indicate clearly the nature of the study.
5. The abstract should be structured using the following subheadings:
Introduction and Objectives: clearly state the purpose of the study
Materials and Methods: describe precisely the selection of observations or experimental subjects
Results: describe the results in a logical sequence
Conclusions: emphasise new and important aspects of the study and the conclusions that may be drawn from them
6. The size of the abstract is limited to 400 words, including title, body of abstracts, spaces, tables and graphics. The submission system will automatically calculate the abstract size and not allow submissions not conforming to size requirements.
7. Use generic, not commercial drug names.

ORAL PRESENTATIONS

Computer projection facilities only will be available in the meeting rooms. Presenting authors will receive all technical information and details prior to the congress to ensure the smooth running of sessions.

The main entrance to the EICC is on Morrison Street where there is a coach drop off point. Access to the EICC Loading Bay (deliveries only) is from the West Approach Road.

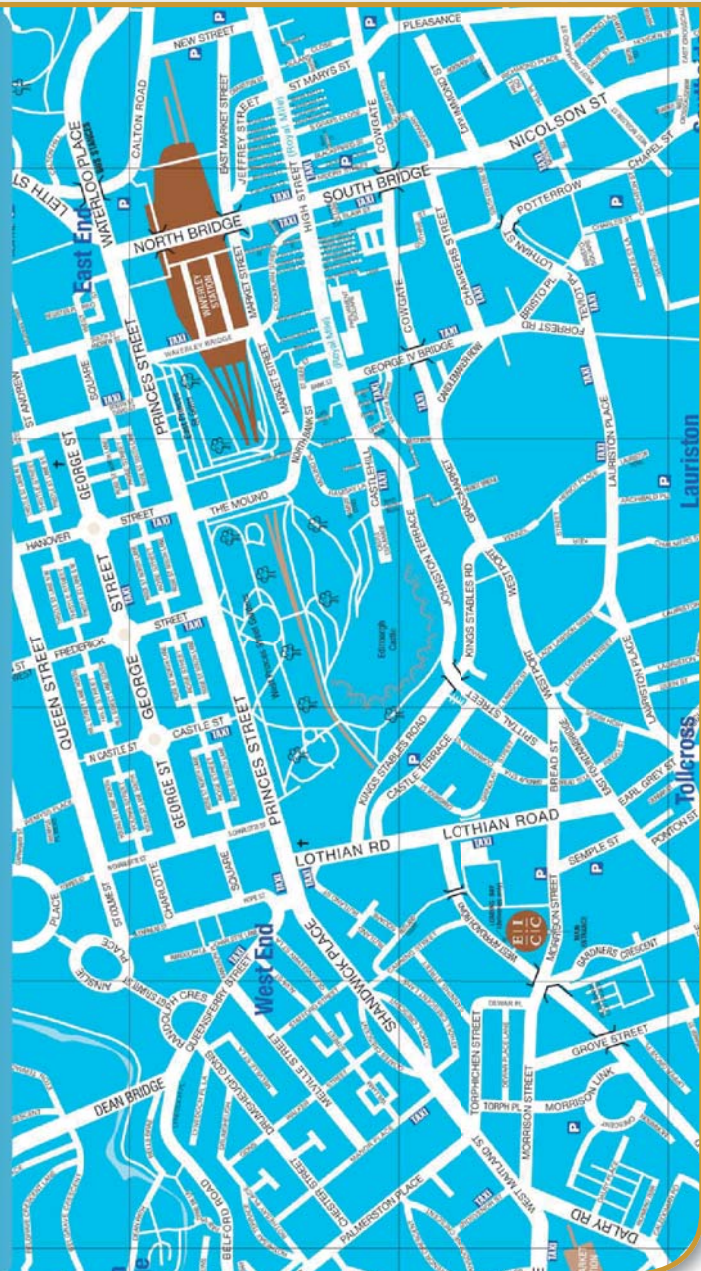
There are a number of car parks within walking distance of the EICC, they are marked on the map. For further details on car parking please visit our website.

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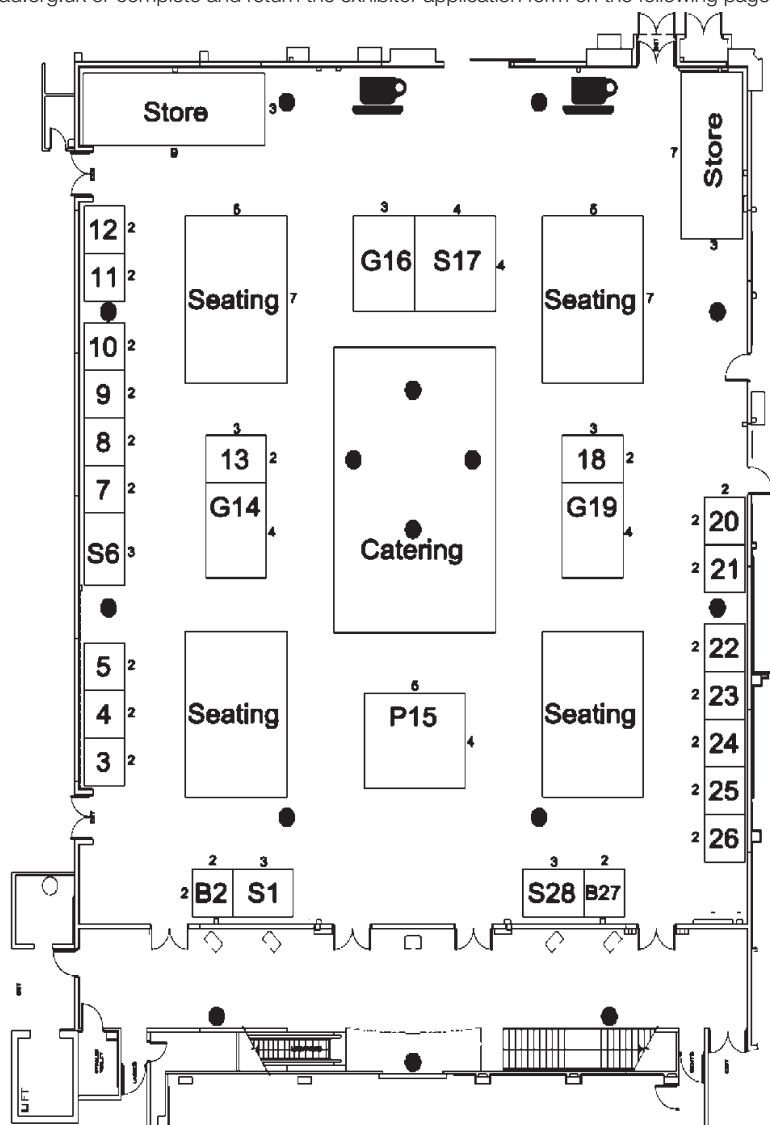




Exhibition
