Goal

This symposium will consist of four days focused on providing information about changing paradigms in diagnostic and therapeutic interventions in cancer therapy. New information gathered through translational research and results of recent clinical trials and new technologies with its application in daily practice in oncology is emerging. Presentations by lectures and interactive case presentations will highlight new information and answer critical questions. The practitioner attending the symposium will obtain current information from interdisciplinary teams of disease-site specific oncologists recognized in their specialty. This symposium is intended to improve practitioner knowledge, performance, patient management and outcomes.

Educational Objectives

After attending the symposium, participants should be able to

- Interpret and utilize genomics, pathology, and molecular testing to properly implement treatment guidelines (*Knowledge, Competence*);
- Assess and apply modern treatment algorithms in a multidisciplinary setting, including the proper use of neoadjuvant strategies and treatment sequencing (*Knowledge, Competence*);
- Review current indications, outcomes, and limitations of surgical approaches, to implement emerging approaches and clinical protocols into practice (*Knowledge, Competence, Performance, Patient Outcomes*);
- Interpret the emergence of important controversial aspects of treatment in cancer patients, including the concepts of prognosis and the staging system (*Knowledge, Competence*);
- Apply recent research findings to screening and risk prediction for cancer patients in a multidisciplinary care setting (*Knowledge, Competence, Performance*);
- Incorporate targeted and other systemic therapies into treatment to improve cancer management and patient outcomes (*Knowledge, Competence, Performance, Patient Outcomes*).

Target Audience

This symposium will be beneficial to medical oncologists, radiation oncologists, surgical oncologists, general surgeons, otolaryngologists, urologists, internists, physician assistants, oncology nurses, and advanced practice nurses involved in the care of patients with breast, head and neck, melanoma, gastrointestinal, genitourinary, and thoracic cancers.

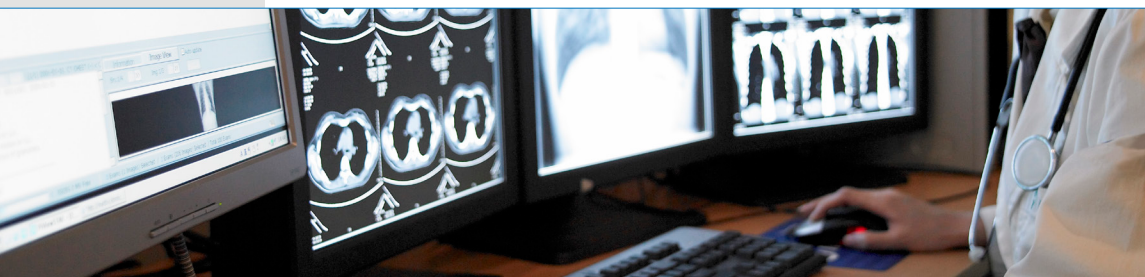
