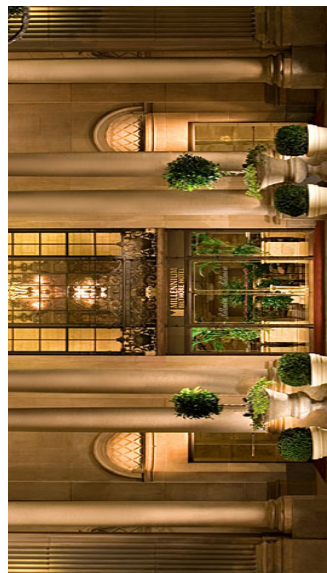

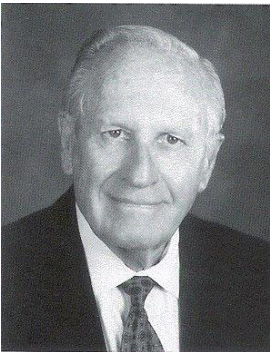

COURSE DESCRIPTION



Max. R. Gaspar, M.D., was an attending surgeon at the Los Angeles County + University of Southern California Medical Center for over fifty years, and served as Chief of Vascular Surgery at LAC+USC for twenty-five years. His teaching and scholarly accomplishments have had a lasting impact on vascular surgery in Southern California. This annual symposium, honoring Dr. Gaspar, addresses a specific topic of interest to physicians and surgeons who care for the patient with vascular disease. This year’s topic is “Peripheral Arterial Disease.” A distinguished faculty is

assembled for the symposium, designed to update the attendee on the current status of the evolving field of peripheral arterial disease. Sixteen didactic lectures will be given to encompass the topics of medical management of peripheral arterial disease, endovascular treatment and open surgical management. Panel discussions are utilized to encourage audience participation.

This year, Dr. Michael S. Conte, Professor of Surgery and Chief of the Division of Vascular and Endovascular Surgery, at the University of California, San Francisco, to give the Max R. Gaspar Lecture in Vascular Surgery. Dr. Conte is a leader in vascular surgery, having led the largest multi-center clinical trial to date comparing angioplasty with bypass for peripheral arterial disease.

Dr. Conte will give his symposium address on September 18, followed by the Gaspar Lecture on September 19 at the USC Health Sciences Campus.

EDUCATIONAL OBJECTIVES

By the end of the course, participants will be able to:

- Outline the medical management of peripheral arterial disease.
- Discuss the new endovascular treatment options for peripheral arterial disease.
- Discuss the stem cells and growth factors for the treatment of peripheral arterial disease.
- Distinguish the advantages and disadvantages of endovascular vs. open mangement of peripheral arterial disease.

This course is intended for physicians, nurses and other allied health professionals in the areas of cardiovascular disease, emergency medicine and general practice who care for patients with peripheral arterial disease who seek to enhance their understanding of vascular medicine, endovascular therapy and treatment options to optimize management of their patients.
