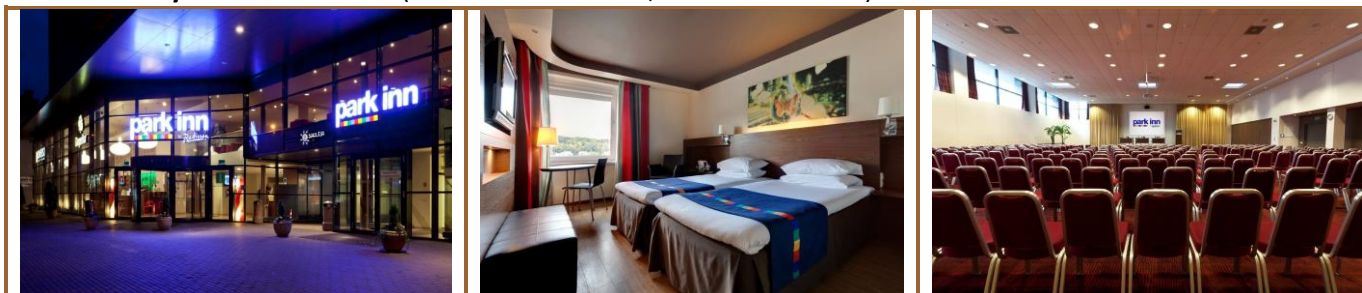

Hotel Park Inn by Radisson Kaunas (K. Donelaicio Str. 27, Kaunas LT-44240)

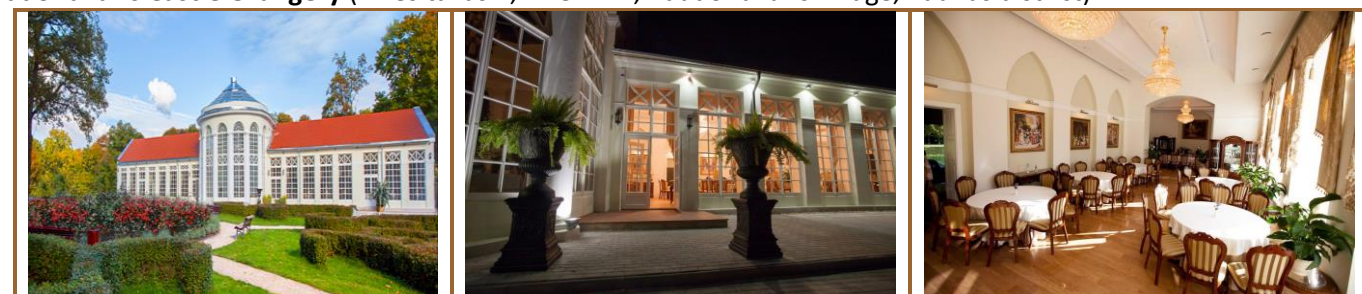
