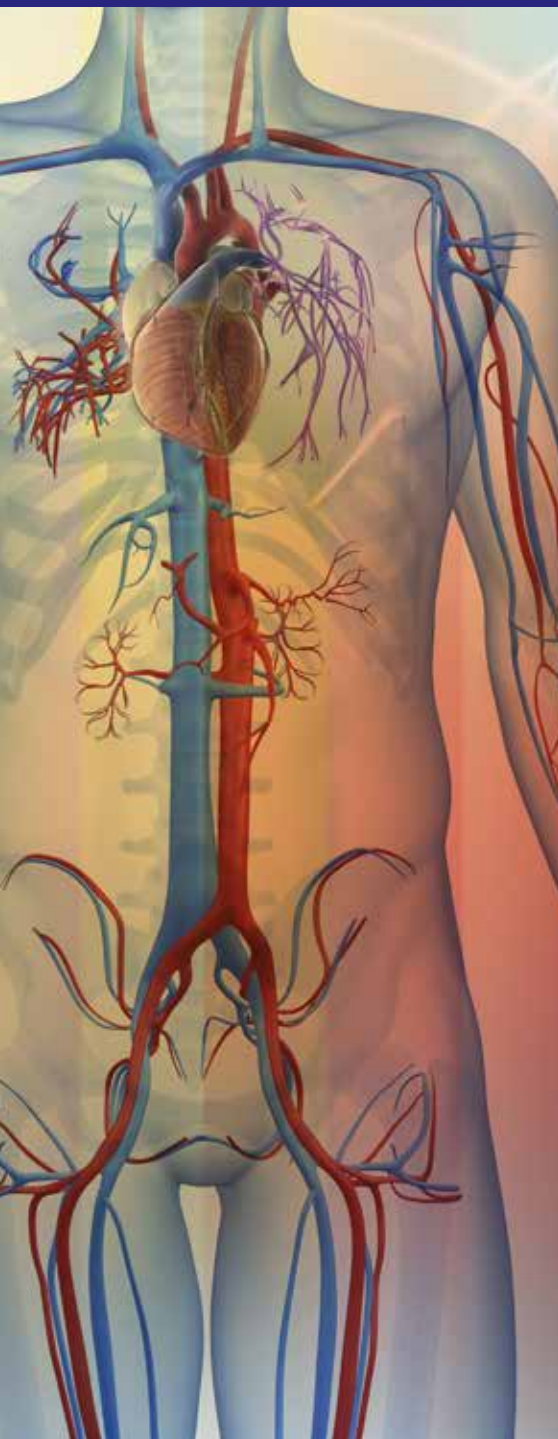

Overall Goals

Aortovascular Summit 2014 is the first combined aortic and vascular therapy course hosted by NewYork-Presbyterian/Columbia University Medical Center. This premier one-day course will present the current state of the art in the diagnosis and management of patients with aortic, brachiocephalic and peripheral vascular disease. Lectures, case presentations, and debates will be presented by our internationally recognized faculty.

Learning Objectives

- Discuss the current surgical and endovascular treatment methods for patients with aortic and vascular diseases including aortic valve disease, aortic aneurysms, aortic dissection, lower extremity ischemia, and carotid disease.
- Evaluate indications, techniques, and results of surgical and endovascular options for complex thoracic aortic diseases including aortic dissection and aneurysm.
- Describe indications, techniques, and results of surgical and transcatheter options for aortic valve disease.
- Evaluate indications, techniques, and results of surgical and endovascular options for complex lower extremity revascularization and limb salvage.
- Identify surgical and endovascular best practices and techniques for the treatment of carotid artery disease.

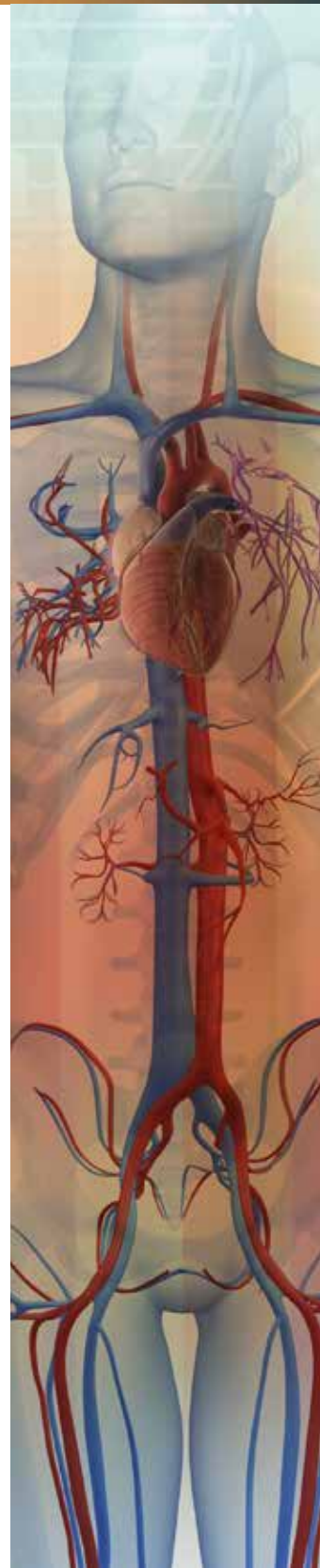
