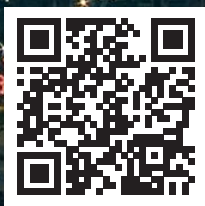

For blind patients, just this first part of a doctor's appointment is a challenge in and of itself. During the course of my treatment, the dentist thoroughly explained each of the next steps and took the time to answer all my questions in detail. He fully met my needs during my treatment. And this is precisely where the key lies, I believe: The desire and also the ability to take the patient's needs and challenges into account during dental treatment. Time is one of the most important aspects of any visit to the doctor, especially for people with mental disabilities or multiple disabilities. In my view, treatment without trust is impossible. We must continue to work on this together in the coming years, all over the world and also here in Germany. I am therefore particularly pleased that you will be bringing together your knowledge and expertise, talking about new methods of treatment and discussing ways of linking the different fields of science and medicine in Berlin this year. According to a study from Germany, people with disabilities are far from always having access to all medical practices, not just to the premises but also to the examination furniture, or access to important information and to communication with the medical personnel there.

Through the valuable work you are doing at this conference, you are creating access to information for all interested parties and, in the process, enabling improvements in the provision of dental care in Germany and throughout the world. 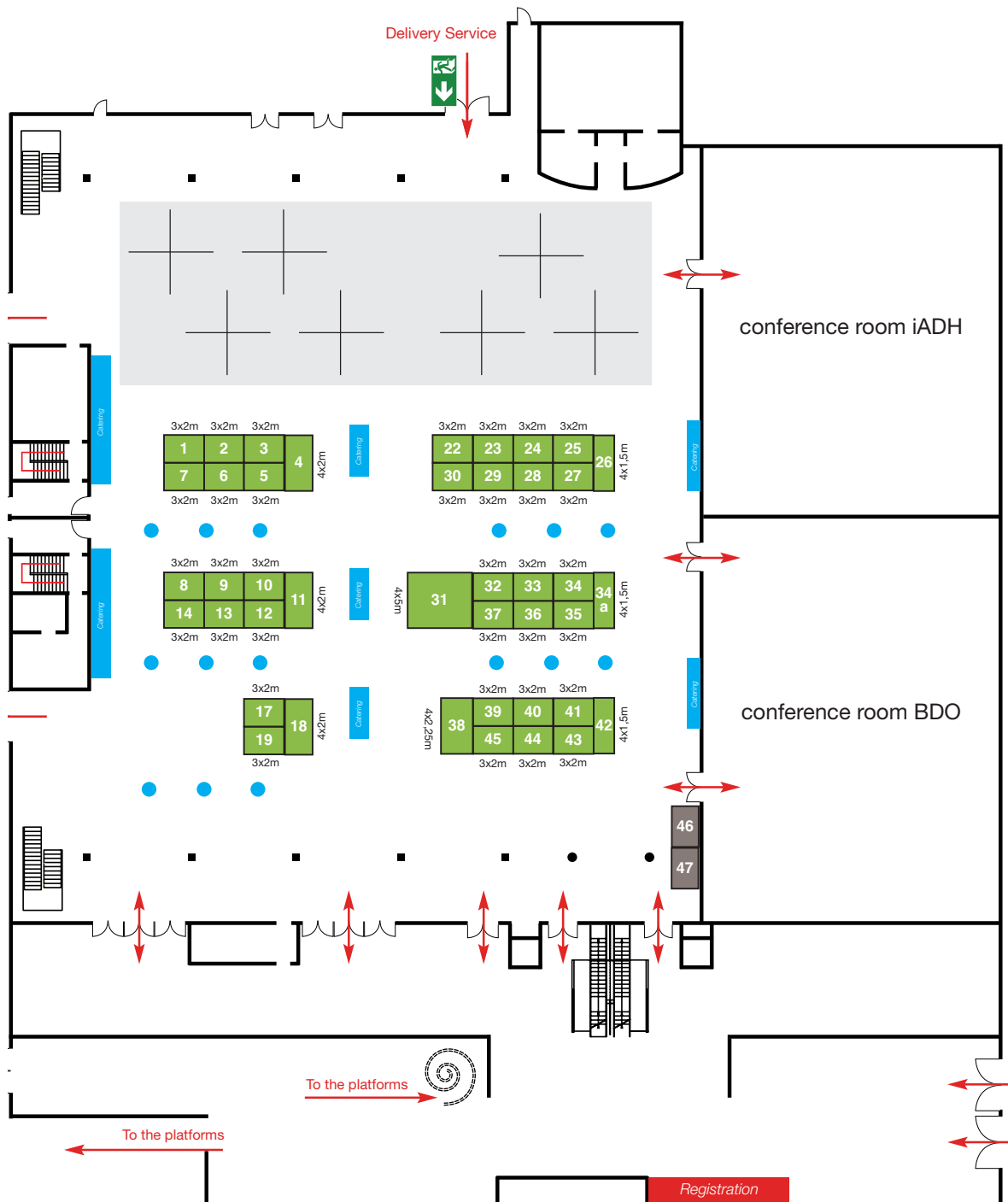
