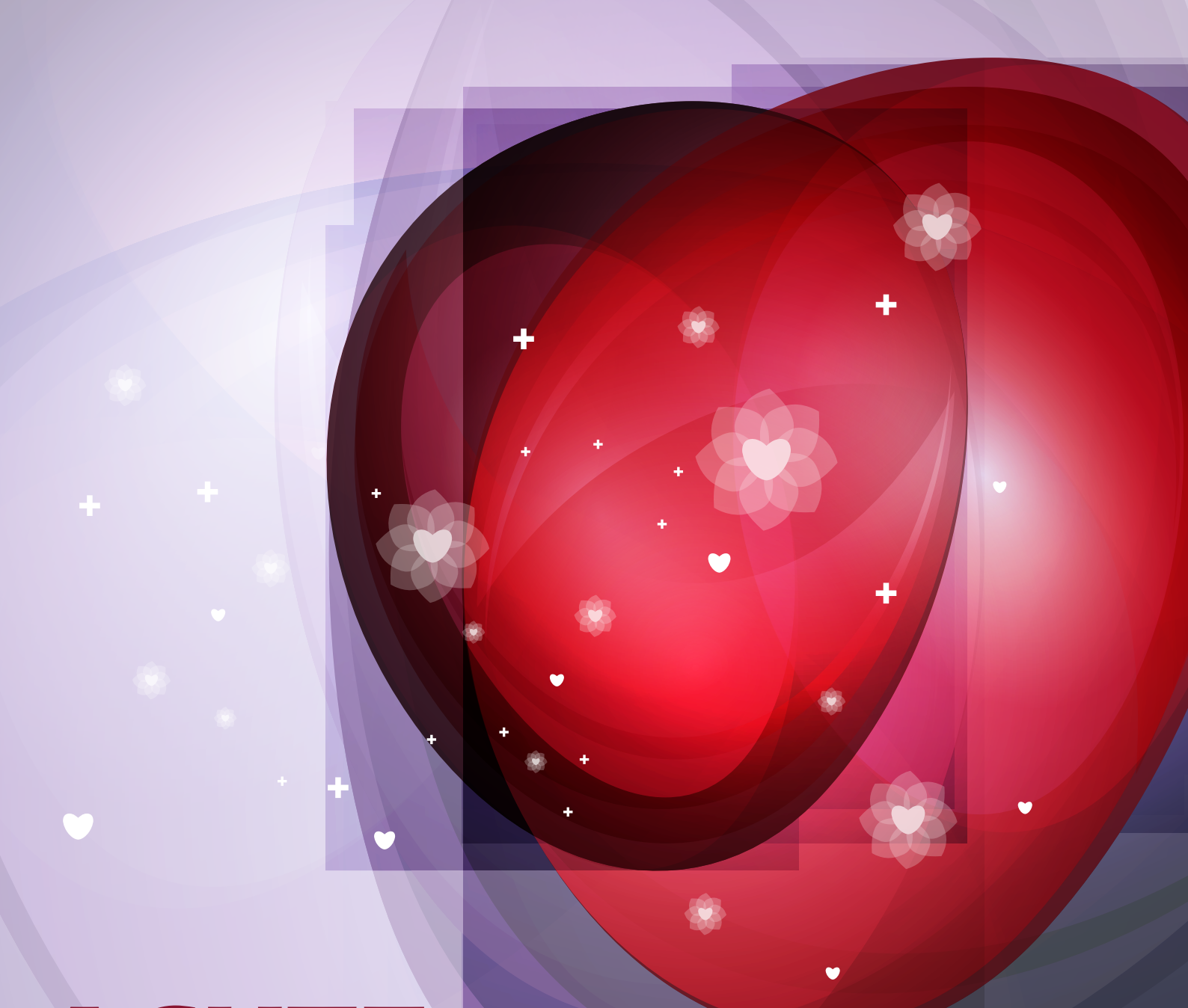

TRANSPORTATION

Please note that the Geneva International Airport now offers every passenger arriving in Geneva a UNIRESO ticket free of charge, valid for 80 minutes in Geneva public transportation. You may obtain your ticket in the baggage claim area, in the ticket dispenser located next to the conveyor belts. A valid air transportation document (Boarding Pass or Plane Ticket) must be presented in the event of a ticket inspection while on the public transportation network.

Visitors staying in a hotel in the Canton of Geneva will benefit from the **free** "Geneva Transport Card", at **no** additional cost. This personal and non-transferable pass is provided upon the visitor's check-in at the hotel, enabling its holder the use of the public transportation network without restriction (bus, train and boat). 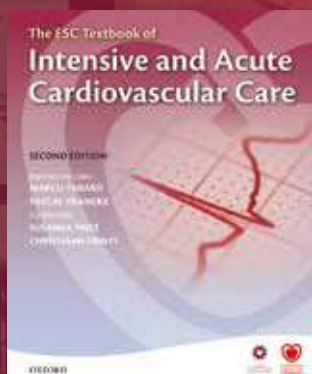

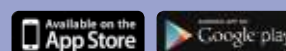

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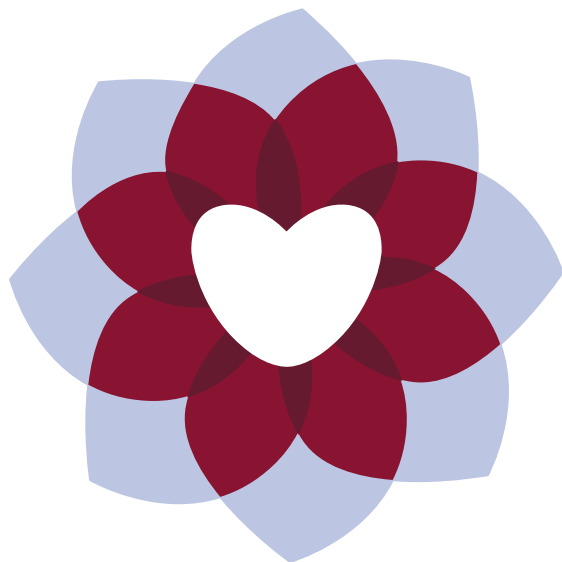
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
