Risky Business: Managing Cancer Risk in Chronic Digestive Conditions

Course Description

This course will focus on the chronic GI conditions that increase cancer risk, such as: chronic pancreatitis, primary sclerosis cholangitis, inflammatory bowel disease, Barrett's esophagus, gastric metaplasia and cystic lesions of the pancreas. Additional topics to be covered include the various colonic polyposis syndromes, serrated adenomas, and Lynch syndrome. Video based case discussions with a multi-disciplinary panel of experts will be utilized to illustrate clinical challenges.

Learning Objectives

Upon completion of this educational activity, participants will be able to:

- Apply cutting-edge endoscopic diagnostic modalities to the early detection of precancerous lesions, confocal endomicroscopy, iScan, NBI and elastography.
- Discuss and view emerging endoscopic therapies for the treatment of gastrointestinal epithelial neoplasia: endoscopic submucosal dissection, endoscopic mucosal resection and cryoablation.
- Identify the challenges, issues and emerging management strategies for the surveillance of patients with conditions that increase gastrointestinal cancer risk: colonic polyposis, ulcerative colitis, Barrett's esophagus, gastric metaplasia and chronic pancreatitis.
