WHAT IS NEOPREP®?

NeoPREP® is a 7-day intensive review of neonatal-perinatal medicine that emphasizes the process of evidence-based clinical decision making and focuses on the scientific basis for the clinical practice of neonatology. The course is also a preparatory education program based on the content specifications outline developed by the American Board of Pediatrics (ABP) for the neonatal-perinatal subspecialty.
