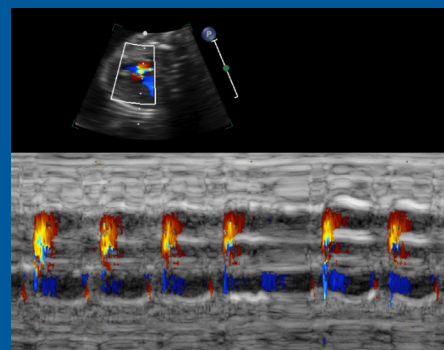
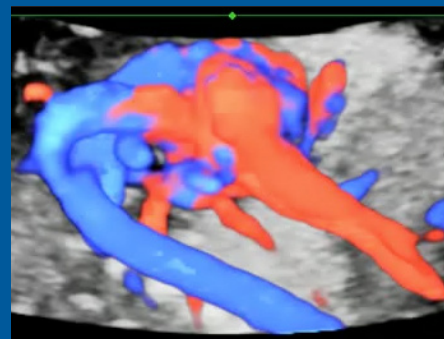

COURSE DESCRIPTION

To provide a comprehensive understanding of the uniqueness of the fetal cardiovascular system, its normal and abnormal embryonic development, echocardiographic imaging of the normal and abnormal fetal heart, morphologic diagnosis and manifestations of simple and complex fetal cardiac disorders, genetics of fetal cardiac disorders, diagnosis and therapy of fetal arrhythmias, history and impact of fetal cardiac intervention, extracardiac fetal and maternal disorders that affect the fetal heart, neonatal catheterization and surgical interventions, and management of the mother and family of the unborn child with heart disease. This 4 1/2-day conference will discuss basic important knowledge and recent advances in diagnosis and management of fetal cardiac disease. Lectures, procedure demonstrations, abstract/poster session, interactive case studies and break-out hands-on learning sessions will focus on the expanding evidence-based care management strategies for clinical decision making. Speakers are nationally and internationally prominent experts, creating an authoritative learning venue for fetal cardiology and fetal cardiac imaging.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

Physicians, sonographers and nurses in the fields of Pediatric Cardiology, Fetal Echocardiography, Obstetrics and Maternal Fetal Medicine should attend. The information presented will also benefit those who care for neonates with cardiac disease or those who plan to embark on fetal ultrasonography as their career.

LEARNING OBJECTIVES

- Narrate the fetal cardiac embryogenesis, anatomy, and physiology relating abnormal cardiac embryogenesis with the development of cardiac pathology.
- Cite the various indications for a fetal cardiac evaluation, illustrate the yield of fetal echocardiography and discuss the impact of antenatal diagnosis of cardiac disease in infant survival.
- Teach a comprehensive, segmental approach in fetal cardiac echocardiographic imaging through both didactics and live case demonstrations with pregnant volunteers.
- Illustrate the use and benefits of Doppler assessment of the fetal arterial and venous systems.
- Discuss the techniques of evaluating the fetal cardiac function.
- Describe the echocardiographic and clinical manifestations of various specific simple and complex fetal cardiac anomalies, relate them to their natural and unnatural history, and present expectations in disease severity at the course of pregnancy and at birth; incorporate in discussion the anomalies of systemic and pulmonary venous connections, atrial and ventricular septation, endocardial cushion, ventricular inlet, chamber and outlet development, conotruncus, great arteries, cardiac position, ductus arteriosus, myocardial disease, aneurysms and diverticula, and pericardial effusion.
- Discuss the ultrasonographic features of various fetal cardiac tumors and extracardiac thoracic and extrathoracic masses that affect the fetal heart; and discuss their natural history and plan for any fetal or postnatal management
- Determine the maternal and placental conditions affecting the fetal cardiovascular system.
- Understand the evaluation of a fetus with congenital heart disease to determine the presence of associated extracardiac abnormalities.
- Describe the utility of new technologies including first trimester fetal cardiac echocardiography and 3D and 4D echocardiography and nuchal translucency evaluation.

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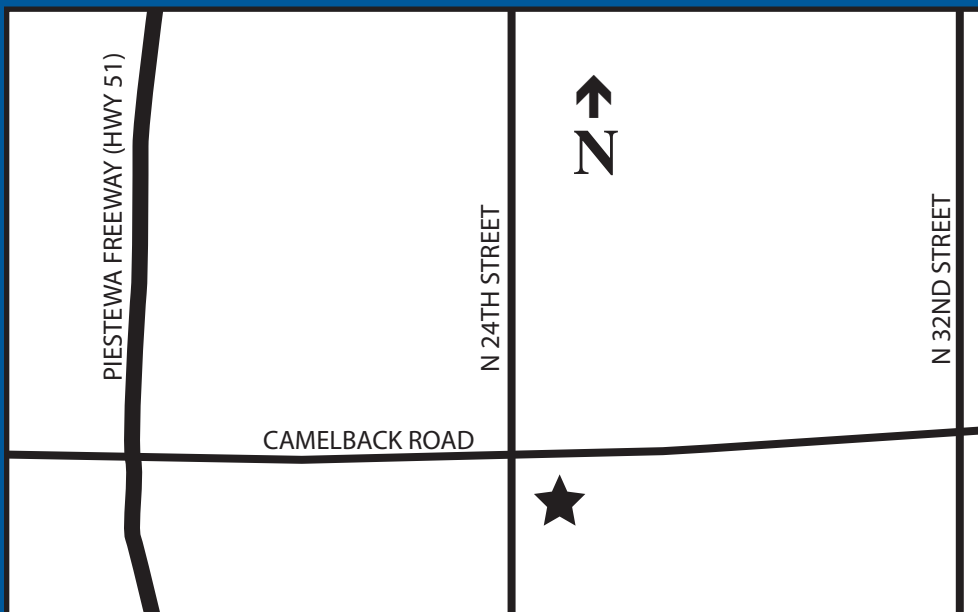
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
