SYMPOSIUM OBJECTIVES

At the end of the meeting the participant will be better able to:

1. Implement effective therapy for treating patients with heart failure including the use of pharmacologic agents and devices.
2. Identify patients who would be candidates for new anticoagulants for treating atrial fibrillation and other CV diseases.
3. Evaluate and manage patients with acute heart failure.
4. Assess and follow patients with heart failure using devices for remote monitoring and with biomarkers.
5. Implement strategies for reducing re-admission after a heart failure hospitalization.
6. Identify and modify risk in patients with atrial fibrillation.
7. Evaluate and manage patients with pulmonary hypertension.
8. Define indications for valve replacement surgery and to determine which patients are candidates for catheter based techniques for aortic valve replacement.
9. Identify patients who are candidates for ICDs (both external and internal) and BiV pacemakers.

NEEDS ASSESSMENT

Over five million Americans (two percent of the U.S.) are living with heart failure. An estimated 670,000 new cases of heart failure (HF) are diagnosed each year and this condition is a major cause of morbidity and mortality (80% of men and 70% of women less than 65 year of age who has HF will die within 8 years.) and is the number one cause of hospitalizations of the elderly in the US. HF is common, but unrecognized and often misdiagnosed. Recent data have shown that drugs and devices that have proven beneficial and are recommended in recent practice guidelines, (HFSA 2010 update of practice guidelines Lindelfield J et al J Cardiac Failure 2010;16: 475) are underutilized (Fonarow GC et al. Circulation 2010;122:585).

Despite important advances in treatment, patients with heart failure continue to experience unacceptably high rates of morbidity and mortality. This along with the enormous cost of caring for a growing number of heart failure patients has resulted in increased scrutiny of existing and emerging therapies. There is a need for education regarding cost effective use of diagnostic tools.
