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Overview

New multidisciplinary guidelines for patient management are issued annually on diverse topics in the treatment of thyroid disease. In 2013, these included recent developments in thyroid cancer pathology and challenging scenarios encountered in benign thyroid disease. Now more than ever, innovations in diagnostic tests, therapies, and surgical technologies are influencing care options for patients with thyroid disorders and thyroid cancer. The format of the course is designed to address the key concepts of these advancements during lectures, panel discussions, and a special keynote address. Ample time will be allotted for participation by the audience with question and answer sessions.

Target Audience

The course is designed for a multi-faceted audience. Physicians, nurses, residents, fellows, and other health care professionals in primary care specialties as well as subspecialists in Endocrinology, Surgery, Otolaryngology, Pathology, Nuclear Medicine, and Genomics are invited to attend.

Objectives

- Discuss clinical consequences associated with an abnormal thyroid-stimulating hormone (TSH)
- Present an up-to-date multidisciplinary approach for the management of thyroid diseases
- Identify risk factors of postsurgical hypothyroidism in patients who underwent thyroid lobectomy for benign thyroid disease
- Compare management of thyroid disease in children vs. adults

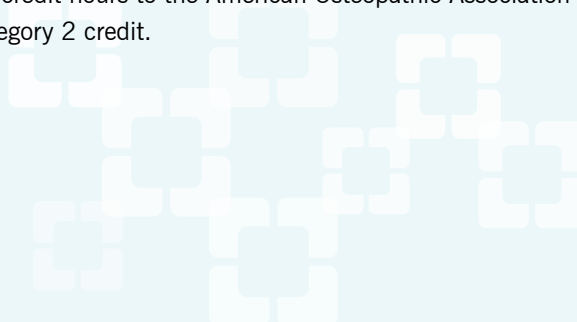
