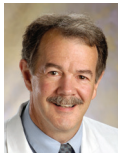

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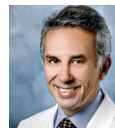

Shaping the Management of Parkinson's Disease: A Comprehensive Review of Discoveries and Clinical Trials

The “modern clinician” is a practical and caring clinician who realizes that therapeutic advancements in Parkinson's disease are occurring at an unprecedented pace. Much of today's treatment approach is based on clinical trial findings. Therefore, it is important for clinicians to not only be updated with the clinical trial results, but also to know the hypotheses behind them, the strengths, weaknesses and other findings outside the primary objectives of these clinical trials. This educational program is unique because it intends to discuss the current approaches to the treatment of Parkinson's disease in the context of the “lessons learned” in clinical trials to date.
