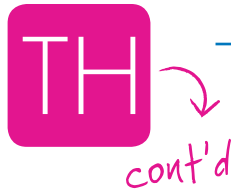

Précis: The world of accredited CME has been transformed in the last few years. In this presentation, we will present CME activities to reward faculty, such as "Learning from Teaching" and examples of CME activities that align education with physician performance and quality improvement.
