



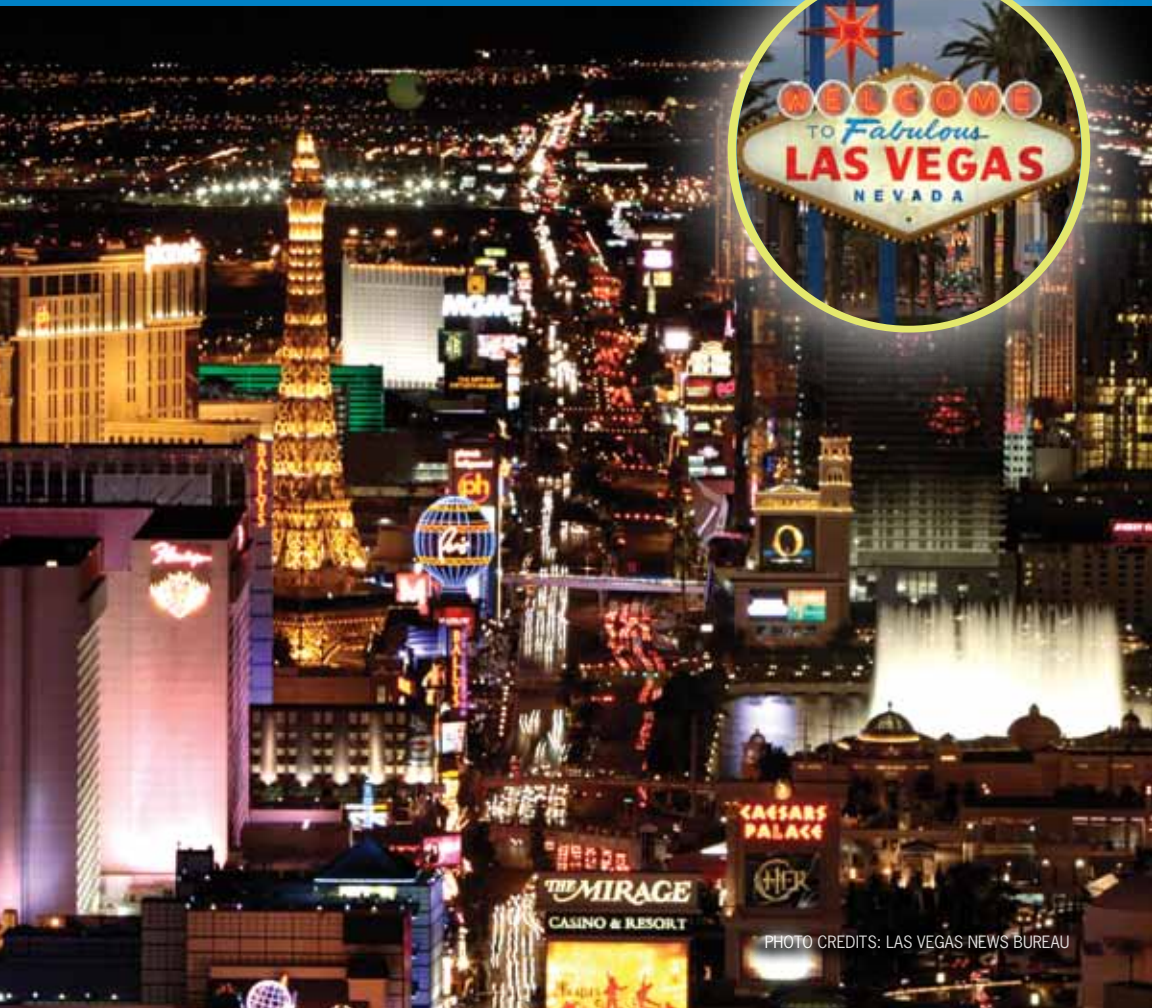

ABOUT THE PAIN MANAGEMENT SYMPOSIUM

The Cleveland Clinic Department of Pain Management is pleased to offer *The 16th Annual Pain Management Symposium*. We invite you to join us in the beautiful setting of Caesars Palace in Las Vegas, Nevada, during the week of February 15 – 19, 2014. This dynamic 5-day Symposium will focus on in-depth reviews and analyses of recent advances in pain medicine and regional anesthesia/analgesia.

Tremendous changes have affected the practice of pain management, particularly therapeutic advances. This 5-day Symposium will promote a better understanding of the pathophysiology of acute and chronic pain, enhance knowledge regarding various chronic neuropathic pain conditions, and critically review novel state-of-the-art interventional and noninterventional techniques in diagnosis and management of chronic pain, cancer pain, and headaches. A nationally renowned faculty will provide insightful assessment and clinical practice evaluation of the topics.

In addition to the didactic program, attendees have opportunities to participate in a variety of educational activities. Each day begins with informal discussions with the faculty during the continental breakfasts. On Sunday through Tuesday, there are optional late afternoon problem-based learning discussions. We also invite you to a reception on Saturday evening, which promises to be a fantastic social gathering opportunity for attendees, their families, friends, and faculty.

Exclusive for practicing physicians and pain medicine fellows in training are two unique workshops, offered multiple times throughout the week. On Saturday through Tuesday, there are optional afternoon cadaver workshops on various novel interventional pain management techniques. On Saturday, Monday, and Tuesday, a live ultrasound-guided workshop covering neck and lumbar spine procedures will be available.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

Practitioners and health care professionals who seek the latest developments in pain medicine, including anesthesia providers, interventional pain specialists, physical medicine and rehabilitation specialists, orthopaedic and spine surgeons, neurologists, headache specialists, palliative care specialists, primary care physicians, physical therapists, physician assistants, and nurses who are interested in the practice of pain management will benefit from this program. Due to limited space, all workshops are only offered to practicing physicians or pain medicine fellows in training.

OBJECTIVES

- Discuss current evidence-based management strategies for treating acute and chronic pain
- Present an in-depth update and analysis of management strategies for neuropathic pain and spinal pain
- Describe how to manage risks associated with pain management including abuse, addiction, and risks to both patients and caregivers
- Demonstrate competencies to perform intraspinal drug delivery and techniques for procedures such as nerve stimulation, cooled RF, and axial blocks
- Describe new approaches for neurostimulation including high-frequency stimulation, adaptive stimulation, burst stimulation, electric peripheral nerve stimulation, and block
- Critically assess strategies for managing chronic pain in select conditions including pelvic pain, visceral pain, facial pain, geriatric pain, pediatric pain, and headache
- Debate the pros and cons of controversies surrounding cervical facets RFA procedures such as using thermal vs cooled techniques and lateral vs posterior approaches
- Summarize research advances and future direction in intraspinal drug delivery
- Address psychological issues associated with pain
- Provide an overview of strategies for addressing the business side of pain management, especially in view of the Affordable Care Act
