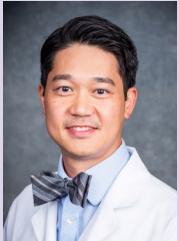

# SCIENTIFIC PROGRAM

## “Reconstructive Surgery Advancements with Prosthodontics”

### Yedeh Ying, DMD, MD



Yedeh Ying, DMD, MD, is an assistant professor in the Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the University of Alabama at Birmingham. Dr. Ying holds a medical degree from Harvard Medical School and subsequently completed his residency in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the Massachusetts General Hospital in 2014. In July 2016, he completed a fellowship in Head and Neck Oncology and Microvascular Reconstructive Surgery at Head and Neck Surgical Associates in Portland, OR. Prior to this, he attended Carnegie Mellon University in Pittsburgh, PA where he received his BS in Electrical and Computer Engineering and obtained his dental degree from the University of Pennsylvania, School of Dental Medicine. Dr. Ying has clinical and research interests in head and neck surgical oncology, microvascular reconstructive surgery, obstructive sleep apnea and improving health outcomes in minority patient populations.

**Description of Session:** *Rehabilitation and reconstruction of the Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery patient can be complex and many times life altering. We routinely see facial defects as a result of benign and malignant tumors, trauma or even infectious processes. The coordination of care to bring a patient to full rehabilitation is complex. We always want to minimize the effects of the defect, and so we have approached this in a multidisciplinary fashion. Surgery has advanced with microvascular reconstruction, being able to replaced large amounts of tissues in predictable patterns. Combining this with maxillofacial prosthodontics, we have been able to provide comprehensive treatment strategies to our patient population. Concepts such as Jaw and Teeth in a Day and facial prosthetics will be reviewed.*

## “Technological Advances in Head and Neck Cancer Detection and Treatment”

### Anthony Morlandt, MD, DDS, FACS



Dr. Morlandt was born and raised in Floresville, Texas and graduated from Baylor University. He completed his DDS magna cum laude at the University of Texas Health Sciences Center in San Antonio, Texas, and received his MD and internship and residency in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery from the University of Alabama School of Medicine. Dr. Morlandt then went on to complete a fellowship in head and neck oncology and microsurgery at the University of Florida College of Medicine in Jacksonville, Florida. He returned to Birmingham where he currently serves as Chief of the Section of Oral Oncology within the Department of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at UAB Medicine and is an associate professor in the departments of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and Otolaryngology. He is Director of the Head and Neck Oncology Fellowship program in OMS. Dr. Morlandt is a Scientist in the Cancer Chemoprevention Program with the UAB O’Neal Comprehensive Cancer Center. In 2015, Dr.

Morlandt received the AAOMS Faculty Educator Development Award and has been inducted into the American Head and Neck Society and is a Fellow of the American College of Surgeons. He serves as Medical Quality Officer for UAB Medicine and is a diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery. Dr. Morlandt’s clinical practice focuses on oral oncology, head and neck microvascular surgery, and oral and maxillofacial surgery. He has authored several peer-reviewed scientific articles and textbook chapters on head and neck ablative and reconstructive surgery. He is particularly interested in helping doctors and their staff identify head and neck cancers and in optimizing patient outcomes following major head and neck surgery.

**Description of Session:** *This session will illustrate the development of a standardized multidisciplinary Oral Oncology program, highlighting technological advances in detection, risk stratification, surgical treatment, and adjuvant therapy for the oral and maxillofacial surgeon.*

## **“The Opioid Crisis: The Forgotten Epidemic”**

### **Kathlyn K. Powell, DMD, MD**



Dr. Kathlyn Powell received her Bachelor of Science degree in Biomedical Sciences from Auburn University. She graduated with a DMD from the University of Alabama School of Dental Medicine and subsequently completed her MD and OMS residency training at the University of Alabama at Birmingham/UAB Hospital. She then completed a fellowship in pediatric oral and maxillofacial surgery under the direction of Dr. Peter Waite. She is an assistant professor at the University of Alabama at Birmingham where she practices at the Children's of Alabama Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Clinic and the UAB Oral and Facial Surgery Clinic of Hoover. She also spends time teaching at the UAB School of Dentistry. She serves as the director of the Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Clinic at Children's of Alabama and the Program Director of the UAB Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Residency Training Program.

**Description of Session:** *Prescription opioids, heroin and fentanyl use is increasing in the United States along with addiction overdose and death. COVID-19 has overshadowed the Opioid Crisis but more people died of drug addiction in the United States in 2020 than ever before. Nearly half of all opioid overdose deaths involve a prescription opioid. This course reviews the history of the opioid epidemic while also looking at dentistry's role in the opioid epidemic. Management of acute and postoperative pain will be discussed along with safe prescribing techniques to avoid abuse and diversion.*

## **“Advances in the Treatment of Dentofacial Deformities”**

### **Brian Kinard, DMD, MD**



Dr. Brian Kinard obtained his B.S. from the University of South Carolina and graduated with Harvard School of Dental Medicine with an Honors in Research in 2012. Dr. Kinard then completed medical school, and general surgery internship followed by residency in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at Emory University School of Medicine. He went on to complete a fellowship in orthognathic surgery with Dr. Jeffrey Posnick in Washington, DC with a focus on comprehensive diagnosis and treatment efficiency to fully address occlusion, the upper airway and facial esthetics. Dr. Kinard specializes in orthognathic surgery, also known as corrective jaw surgery, for those with acquired or congenital dentofacial deformities. His clinical and research interests include comprehensive evaluation and treatment of occlusion, possible upper airway obstructions and facial esthetics. He has authored several peer-reviewed scientific articles and textbook chapters on the diagnosis and orthognathic correction of dentofacial deformities.

**Description of Session:** *The diagnosis and orthognathic correction of individuals with dentofacial deformities continues to evolve rapidly. After giant leaps in surgical innovation through rigid fixation and virtual surgical planning, efficiency of surgical care is a domain for future improvement. This lecture will review efficiency of care protocols, updates and trends in virtual planning, as well a review a modification to the sagittal split osteotomy.*

**The scientific sessions have been approved for 7.5 CE credit hours.**

The famous author Pat Conroy taught Sallie Ann along with many Gullah children at the Maryfield School, and their time together is remembered in Conroy's bestselling book *The Water is Wide* (fun fact Sallie Ann was "Ethel" in the novel and Daufuskie is known as "Yamacraw Island"). Nowadays, Robinson is a recognized TV personality, celebrity chef, and spokesperson for preserving the legacy of Gullah culture.

The moss-covered live oaks and architecture make you feel you are back in time. There is something for everyone and is wonderful for children. Transportation around the property is mainly by bicycles or golf carts. There is valet parking available, and the hotel has several Cadillac cars and SUV's, you can check out complimentary for four hours through the concierge. Bicycle and golf cart rentals are available.

Some of the activity offerings are a Jack Nicholas' designed golf course, tennis, croquet, pickle ball, basketball, bocce, kayaking, spa, swimming- both adult and family pools. Private fishing and boat riding with a naturalist is available to reserve. There are riding stables and a shooting club. In the evenings they have several fire pits where they roast S'mores. In the Inn in the afternoon is "parching" where lemonade, tea and flavored waters along with several different types of delicious cookies are offered complimentary. Coffee is also a complimentary offering in the mornings on the porch in the Inn.

Several dining choices include **Canoe Club** - upscale with excellent food and views, **Buffalo's** - casual southern Italian, **Octagon** - restaurant and bar located in the Inn, and in Moreland Village two choices, **Cole's** - beautiful setting for comfort food and **Canteen** - casual for breakfast and lunch. It is recommended that you make reservations for dinner at the restaurants as early in advance as possible since these aren't large facilities and going off the property takes more than 30 minutes to get to the closest restaurants. **Melt** is a fun ice cream parlor located beside Buffalo's.

Montage is located about 30 minutes from the quaint town of **Bluffton** where you find boutiques, art galleries and restaurants. **The Pearl, Bluffton Room and Farm** are three highly recommended restaurants for dinner and **The Cottage** is great for lunch.

The resort is pet friendly, there are educational activities for children 6 to 17, and there are two unique treehouses for climbing and miles of bike paths.

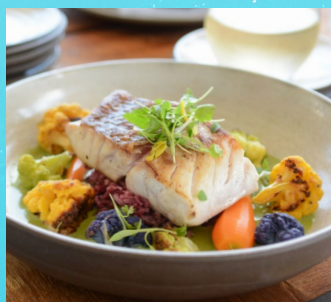

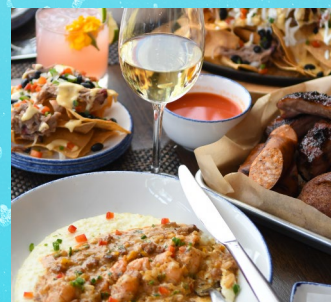

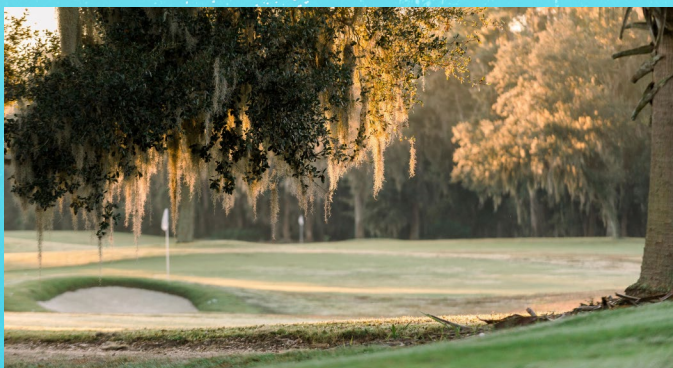
