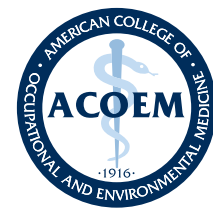

AMA Guides to the Evaluation of Permanent Impairment – A Case Based Approach to Understanding and Implementing the Guides

July 28, 2017 in Rosemont, Illinois

This one-day course will focus on the three musculoskeletal chapters of the AMA Guides (Upper Extremity, Lower Extremity and Spine) and will include cases of neurological injury, pulmonary illness and other areas. The complex cases will use scenarios where multiple organ systems will need to be evaluated, thereby utilizing multiple chapters of the AMA Guides.

The course will work through real case presentations with faculty taking the attendees through the use of the AMA Guides and pointing out details and pitfalls. Attendees are then moved into groups of four or five where they work on cases using the AMA Guides. Take advantage of this unique opportunity to experience AMA Guides training through a new approach to learning.

Musculoskeletal Exam and Treatment Techniques

July 29-30, 2017 in Rosemont, Illinois

This two-day course will feature both lectures and interaction with a diverse faculty who will deliver a significant “hands-on” workshop component. Subjects include: general management of work injuries, causality analysis, orthopedic urgencies and emergencies, and the timing and choice of x-rays. The workshops will review selected aspects of the physical examination and give an overview of injection techniques.

Emphasis will be placed upon topics that will be of the most relevance to everyday practice. In addition to focusing upon the “usual” diagnosis and treatment issues, the faculty has drawn upon their own considerable experience in reviewing the work of other physicians who manage injuries to determine which aspects of patient care are most often deficient. This course will provide general information regarding the diagnosis and treatment of musculoskeletal injuries and will convey how management of patients who have been injured at work differs from management of patients with non-work-related musculoskeletal complaints.

Medical Review Officer Course

Today, physicians in many specialties conduct drug and alcohol tests for business, industry, government agencies and schools. The need for trained medical review officers (MROs) to evaluate test results extends to more than 20 million Americans. The Drug-Free Workplace Act affects all federal agencies. Mandatory alcohol and drug testing is now required of all intrastate truckers, commercial driver’s license holders, and other transportation workers. In joint government agreements, the United States, Canada, and Mexico also monitor truckers crossing international borders. More than 60 percent of large private employers require drug and alcohol testing. ACOEM has been the educational provider of choice for MROs since 1990.

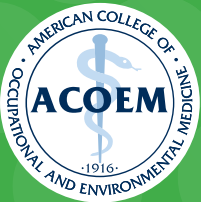
