Overview

The ASAM Review Course has a major impact on helping physicians prepare for the addiction medicine exam and increasing attendees' knowledge on substance use disorders. The ASAM Review Course is widely recognized as the essential primer for physicians and other healthcare professionals who are preparing for a career in addiction medicine. This two-and-a-half-day course is mapped to the addiction medicine exam blueprint and features an outstanding faculty.

Addiction Medicine (ADM) Official ABMS Subspecialty

In March 2016, the American Board of Medical Specialties (ABMS) announced the recognition of Addiction Medicine as a new subspecialty under the American Board of Preventive Medicine (ABPM). Beginning in October 2017 ABPM officially administered the board exam for ADM.

From October 2017 until October 2021, physicians who have a primary ABMS board (including current addiction medicine specialists with a primary ABMS board certification) may apply to take the exam and become and/or continue to be an addiction medicine specialist.

After the five-year period ends, a one-year fellowship will be required to become an addiction medicine specialist.

Applications Accepted April 2 - July 11, 2018

Physicians interested in taking the exam and becoming certified in ADM need to complete the application on the ABPM website. The application period for the exam will be April 2, 2018 through July 11, 2018. Applicants will be notified of approval electronically by ABPM.

Exam Administration

A variety of exam dates and locations will be offered in October 15, 2018 – November 4, 2018. Approved applicants will have the opportunity to select their exam location and date upon approval notification. To learn more about the addiction medicine specialty and the exam visit www.theABPM.org.

Learning Objectives

Upon completion, participants should be able to:

- Demonstrate practical knowledge of the neurobiology of addiction and articulate its activity in terms useful in a clinical setting
- Describe the effects of alcohol, tobacco and other drugs in both tolerant and non-tolerant individuals
- Describe the process for diagnosing addiction and differentiating the symptoms of addiction from those of other medical or psychiatric disorders
- Explain the various pharmacologic and psychosocial treatments for substance use disorders, and describe the factors that should be considered in selecting a treatment modality to match a patient's needs
- Describe the precipitants of relapse and current evidence-based practices to prevent and manage relapse
