The 34th Annual Dental Review will be held at the beautiful Embassy Suites Resort at Kingston Plantation and should prove to be a **GREAT UPDATE FOR THE GENERAL DENTIST**. This year's program will feature **MANY NEW TOPICS** of interest to the GP. The program will be highlighted by an excellent line-up of speakers including returning clinician, Dr. Glenn Maron, a noted oral surgeon who is our featured speaker, as well as the ever popular guest speaker, Dr. Randy Huffines, along with outstanding faculty from UNC.

Day 1 will be highlighted by Dr. Glenn Maron who is back by popular demand. Dr. Maron is the team doctor for the Atlanta Braves, the Atlanta Falcons and was the designated oral surgeon for the Summer Olympic Games in 1996. Dr. Maron is widely known for his "common sense" presentations on clinically relevant topics in oral surgery and related topics. A board-certified oral surgeon, Dr. Maron currently maintains a private practice in Atlanta, and serves as a Clinical Assistant Professor in the Division of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the Emory University School of Medicine. His presentation on Day 1 will include an eye-opening and vital **medical update for the GP with topics ranging from bisphosphonates to blood thinners**.

Also returning on Day 1 is the well-known, Dr. Randy Huffines, one of our most popular guest speakers, who will review **how best to avoid mistakes with implant**

overdentures. Topping off a superb day of talented teachers is Dr. Taiseer Sulaiman, who will present a **practical review of dental adhesion**.

Day 2 will start with a great overview by Dr. Ed Swift of **current concepts in light curing**. Additionally on Day 2, Dr. Andrea Zandona will provide the latest information on **current approaches to caries management**. The talented Dr. Andre Ritter will also provide an evidence based look at **factors affecting the longevity of composite restorations**. Finally Dr. Harald Heymann will delve into **interdisciplinary considerations in the replacement of missing laterals**, including important considerations in the staging of anterior dental implants.

Day 3 will kick off with a valuable review by one of the most respected experts in prosthodontics, Dr. Terry Donovan. Dr. Donovan will provide a salient presentation on **current cementation protocols for clinical success**. Thereafter, guest speaker, Dr. Randy Huffines will provide a unique lecture called **"Tips from Techs: a valuable review of insights gained from our lab tech colleagues on how we can best improve our restorative outcomes"**. Finally, our featured speaker, Dr. Glenn Maron, will provide an invaluable **update on oral and maxillofacial infections and how best to treat them**. COURSE OBJECTIVES

4. Identify the various types of light curing systems and the clinical considerations that are vital to optimal light curing.
5. Review the various types of caries management systems and the clinical indications for each.
6. Identify the various vital factors affecting the longevity of anterior and posterior composite restorations.
7. Discuss the various restorative options for the temporary replacement of missing anterior teeth and the important factors in staging future anterior implants.
8. Review the various types of cementation protocols for the optimal placement of various indirect restorations.
9. Discuss the various types of maxillofacial infections encountered clinically and the pharmaceutical treatment options for each.

MEET THE SPEAKERS

Dr. Glenn Maron received both his DDS degree in 1986 as well as his training in oral and maxillofacial surgery at Emory University. A board-certified oral surgeon, Dr. Maron currently maintains a private practice in Atlanta, and serves as a Clinical Assistant Professor in the Division of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the Emory University School of Medicine. Dr. Maron is highly regarded for his skills in reconstructive surgery as well as managing complex maxillofacial trauma cases.

Dr. Randy Huffines for 30 years has treated older and medically complex adults in a traditional private practice, nursing homes, and hospitals. In 1988 he completed a two-year clinical Fellowship in Geriatric Dentistry. For the past 25 years he has been Director of Geriatric Dentistry at the Quillen Medical Center in Johnson City, Tennessee. He has faculty appointments in colleges of dentistry, medicine, nursing, and allied health. Dr. Huffines is a Past President and a Fellow of the American Society for Geriatric Dentistry, Fellow of the American Association of Hospital Dentists, and Diplomate of the American Board Special Care Dentistry. He is a Fellow of and Examiner for the Royal College of Surgeons, Edinburgh, Scotland.
