The Purpose

The **28th Annual Advances in Urology** meeting is designed for practicing urologists who are interested in updating their knowledge in the diagnosis, evaluation and management of urologic problems. A distinguished faculty will present advances in the management of urological problems including uro-oncology, sexual function, laparoendoscopic, robotic, minimally invasive surgery, prostate and bladder cancer and reconstruction surgery with a strong emphasis on the technical aspects of various urological procedures. Important updates for practicing urologists on skills enhancement through simulation, health policy and workforce utilization of allied health providers will also be provided.

- Summarize** targeted therapies for advanced renal cell carcinoma
- Discuss** advances in robotic partial nephrectomy
