Overview, Learner Outcome and Target Audience

This conference will provide education regarding state-of-the-art treatment of medical and surgical conditions commonly encountered in the pediatric acute care setting. Participants will be able to enhance their knowledge of caring for pediatric patients and suggest one practice change in their professional setting. This program will be of interest to physicians, physician assistants, nurse practitioners, nurses and other healthcare professionals who work in acute, urgent and primary care settings.

Objectives
