The multispecialty team offers autologous, related and unrelated allogeneic blood and marrow stem cell and umbilical cord blood transplantation services for a variety of hematologic and oncologic disorders. An outpatient center provides pre-transplant evaluation and post-transplant follow-up care. Moffitt's BMT Program is accredited by FACT (Foundation of Accreditation of Cellular Therapies).
