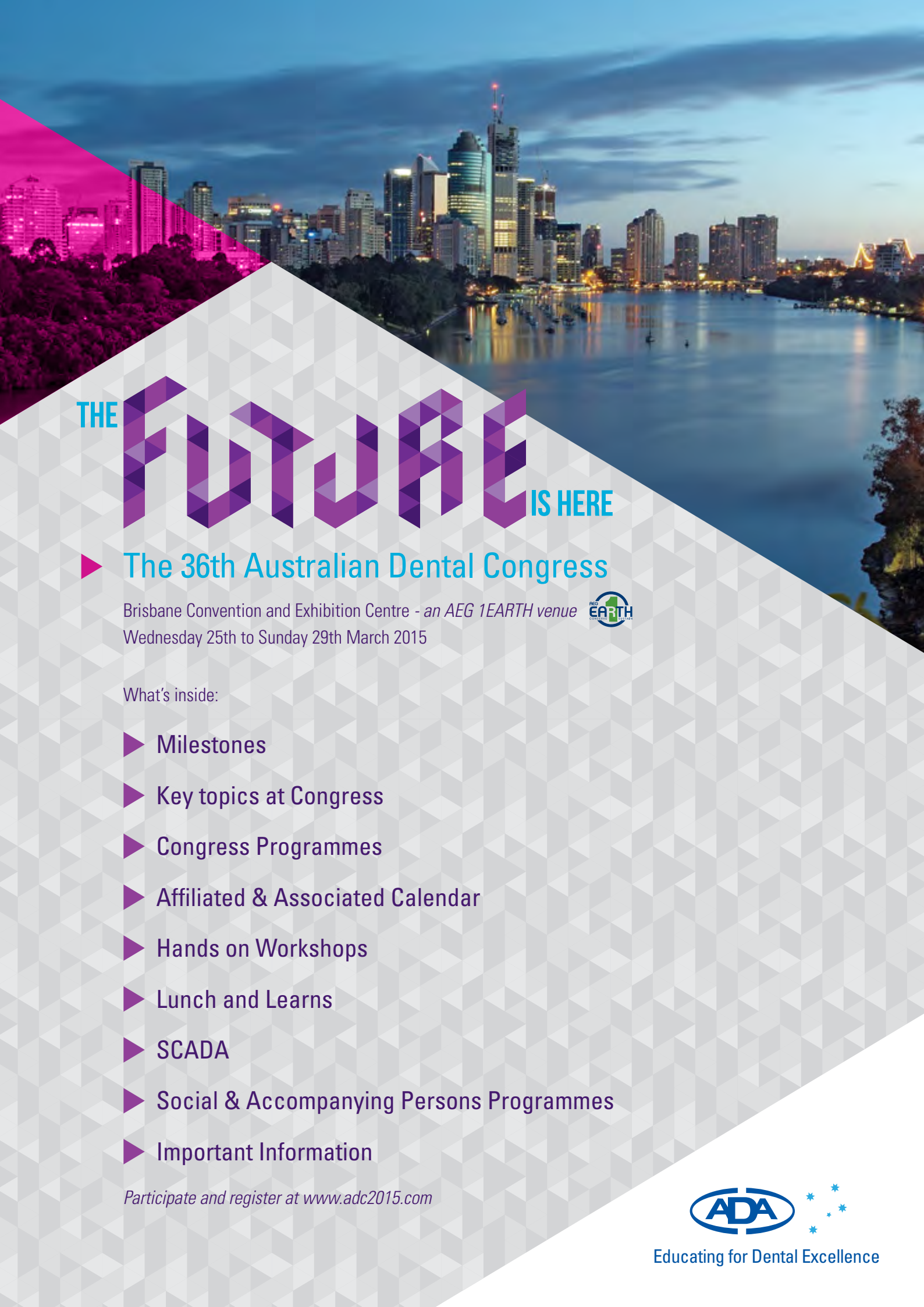

INVITATION FROM THE CONGRESS CHAIRMAN



On behalf of the Local Organising Committee of the 36th Australian Dental Congress, it is with great pleasure that I invite you to attend Congress and enjoy the river city of Brisbane.

The theme for Congress is "The Future is Here" and all speakers will have the opportunity to agree with this or indeed to challenge that further innovation and development is possible. Either way the

latest in clinical practice, materials and technology will be discussed and displayed.

Over three and a half days, highly acclaimed International and Australian speakers supported by contemporary research, will present a wide range of subjects relevant to clinical practice.

The Main Scientific Programme will have up to four concurrent sessions to choose from on some days with something for everyone. The topics covered by the various speakers are comprehensive and diverse.

These presentations will be complemented by Hands-on Workshops at three separate venues prior to Congress. The Lunch and Learn sessions have been expanded and will provide attendees the opportunity to interact with clinicians in small groups on three days.

In addition to a General ADA Forum, there will a Graduate Forum and a Transitioning from Practice to Retirement Forum.

Specific programmes for Dental Assistants, Practice Managers and Allied Dental Personnel will be available enabling all members of the dental team to participate in Congress activities.

An extensive industry exhibition will be held alongside the Congress enabling all delegates, between scientific sessions, to experience the latest in equipment and materials that manufacturers and suppliers have to offer. There will be an exhibition late night with a cocktail reception on the Thursday evening.

Social activities including a not to be missed welcome function and a Dentists Late Night featuring Cosentino's World of Illusion have been arranged so that Congress provides everyone an opportunity to renew friendships and make new ones.

All of this takes place in the BCEC – the Brisbane Convention and Exhibition Centre the venue selected to host the G20 meeting. KEY TOPICS AT CONGRESS ADDRESS OUR CURRENT FUTURE

“The Future is Here” is not just the theme for the 2015 Australian Dental Congress, it is what we are currently living and experiencing in our daily lives, and we must also realise and accept it also underpins our dental practice. For many years we have been discussing the scientific, technical and digital advances and developments that have the potential to change the way we practice dentistry and the improvements that will provide optimal oral care for our patients. We have been contemplating the future of dental practice with changing patient demographics, evolving models of care, changes in business structures and workplace practices, more complex regulatory models and frameworks, and modifications to the workforce and scope of practice within the dental workforce. Now we have moved beyond discussion and contemplation and have become actively embedded in these changes. Now is the future, and we must embrace it. The 2015 Australian Dental Congress will showcase this transition from possibility to reality and demonstrate where we are and what we can do in contemporary dental practice.

The speakers and topics included in the 2015 ADC have been carefully selected and aim to address the issues relevant to our clinical practice. Australia leads the world in many areas of dental practice, but we can also learn much from our international colleagues. During Congress the keynote and invited international speakers will be discussing an expansive array of topics and disciplines and providing the basis for our national experts to integrate and expand upon, thereby sharing their knowledge and experiences with delegates. Throughout the four concurrent sessions in the Main Scientific Programme, the Hands-on Workshops and ‘Lunch and Learn’ sessions there is ample opportunity to participate and become involved in a range of aspects in dentistry and become part of our current future.

So, what will be presented at the 2015 Congress? Just about everything. It is possibly the largest programme ever offered at an Australian Dental Congress. The main scientific programme offers 22 hours of Continuing Professional Development with an additional 12.5 hours available through the Workshops, Forums and Lunch and Learn sessions. With around 35 hours of CPD available during Congress, there is a smorgasbord and abundance of knowledge and education all in the one location. Our international speakers will be covering a diverse range of clinical topics including; the ageing patient and geriatric oral health care, tooth wear, fixed and removable prosthodontics, pulp biology, endodontics, microbiology, cariology, periodontics, 3D oralmaxillofacial radiology, restorative dentistry, dental materials and oral medicine. Invited national speakers will then complement these presentations and cover all other disciplines within dental practice.

The keynote international speakers will open the Main Scientific Programme on the Thursday morning (26th March 2015) with an overview of their disciplines and topics, and then expand and develop their themes throughout the following days ending with an overall summary to complete the story on the Sunday morning

(29th March 2015). This will be an exciting opportunity to follow their journey and integrate their information with the high calibre presentations provided by our other international and national speakers thus accruing a depth and breadth of information to take back and implement into your practice.

Congress is not just about the science and clinical practice, it is also about the profession and business of dentistry. What is this future that we are now living in? The 2015 ADC includes presentations in the main scientific programme specifically addressing many of the non-clinical issues affecting our profession. Specific sessions will discuss aspects of practice management, practice accreditation, e-Health, regulations and restrictions, and the changes and challenges for our dental workforce.

Having covered your professional practice with a plethora of scientific and technical lectures and programmes there are other events that will help secure your future.

So if you are a student or recent graduate, your immediate future will be assisted by the innovative Recent graduate forum (26 March 2015) where you will have the opportunity to ask questions of your mentors about issues of concern to you and as to find out how best to develop your professional skills and help enhance your dental career.

If you are in practice and see challenges that are confronting you the ADA Open Forum (Wednesday 25 March 2015) is for you. Here you will have Federal Council of ADA attending and you can address your concerns to them. This will be a golden opportunity for the membership to air their concerns about the current and future dental environment to the leaders of the ADA. It will be conducted in an informal way under the direction of Julie McCrossin as facilitator. Those that attended the ADA Workshop on Workforce in Melbourne in 2013 will remember the energetic way she facilitates these events.

Should you be thinking about slowing down in your practice then how to organise this slowdown is important. Your future will be enhanced by you attending the “Transitioning from practice to retirement Forum” (Saturday 28 March 2015). Here you will receive some sage advice on what needs to be done to secure your future in comfort.

In addition to the four streams in the main scientific programme there are also dedicated streams for Allied Dental Personnel, Practice Managers and Dental Assistants.

There will be no shortage of options, but possibly some hard decisions on what to attend.

So, the future is here, and it will also be in Brisbane in March of 2015 at the Australian Dental Congress. We all need to experience and embrace it and I look forward to seeing you in the future.

PROFESSOR MAURICIO ARAUJO (BRAZIL)

Alveolar Ridge Preservation Techniques

Professor Mauricio Araujo is a periodontist working in private practice and at the State University of Maringa, Parana, Brazil, where he is Chairman of the Perio/Implant Research Unit. He completed his PhD at the University of Gothenburg, Sweden in 1998, and he has published ground breaking research in the fields of ridge alterations following tooth extraction, ridge preservation, bone formation in extraction sockets and immediate implant placement. He is an ITI Fellow, the ITI Section Chair in Brazil and an Osteology Foundation Board member.

This workshop will describe a series of studies in humans and animals regarding the preservation of the alveolar process dimensions following tooth extraction and will demonstrate that following tooth extraction the alveolar process undergoes a marked alteration that is more pronounced in the buccal than in the lingual/palatal compartment. Post-extraction bone resorption represents a challenge for the clinician. It may lead to aesthetic problems and more complex implant installation due to dimensional alterations of the ridge. Thus, the concept of preventing bone loss following tooth extraction is very attractive. The workshop will look at the clinical procedure that aims at preserving the bone volume at the time of tooth extraction which is called Ridge Preservation. Studies that have evaluated the benefit of socket graft for the maintenance of the ridge profile will be presented. It will be demonstrated in this workshop that socket graft with bone substitutes can compensate for post-extraction bone loss. In addition clinical cases will be presented that illustrate the surgical techniques, and the outcome of ridge preservation procedures will be presented and discussed.

The workshop will be held in the Anatomy Surgical Skills Laboratory within the new Griffith University Gold Coast Campus facilities. Griffith Universities Gold Coast Campus boasts state-of-the-art facilities, including the Griffith Health Centre and new School of Dentistry and Oral Health, and is co-located with the Gold Coast University Hospital.

DR DONALD TYNDALL (USA)

3D Oralmaxillofacial Radiology

Dr. Donald Tyndall is Professor in the Department of Diagnostic Sciences and General Dentistry at the UNC School of Dentistry. He received his D.D.S. in 1980 from the UNC School of Dentistry, his M.S.P.H. in Radiological Hygiene and Medical Physics from the UNC School of Public Health in 1984, and his Ph.D. in Health Physics and Radiation Biology from UNC in 1988. He became a Diplomate of the American Board of oral and Maxillofacial in 1990. Donald holds memberships in organizations including the American Dental Association, the American Academy of Oral and Maxillofacial Radiology, The International Association of Dentomaxillofacial Radiology and the International Association for Dental Research. His research interests include: 3-D digital imaging, implant radiology, applications of cone beam computed tomography in dentistry and the use of computers in image processing. His work has been published in more than 90 journal articles.

The topics covered in this hands on workshop will include discussions around the imitations and issues with respect to 2D radiological techniques and how these are overcome with 3D cone beam. The Dosimetry of 2D vs 3D diagnostic radiology,

the fundamentals of maxillo-facial radiological diagnostics and detailed CBCT anatomy will be discussed. The workshop will also look at the radiological classification of maxillo-facial lesions with case examples. In addition during the workshop there will be an introduction to the 3D software, the orientation and views and the future advances and uses that may be possible. Hands-on diagnostics leading participants through a series of cases with common maxillo-facial lesions, pathology and diseases will ensure a comprehensive workshop programme.

This workshop will be held with the Brisbane Convention and Entertainment Centre and each participant will have access to an individual computer and screen to enable hands on diagnosis and manipulation of images and enhanced use of the various software options. The Brisbane Convention and Exhibition Centre is a world-class purpose-built venue renowned for its operational and service excellence and the BCEC was most recently recognised for its excellence and ability to host the largest gathering of world leaders ever held in Australia – the G20 during November of 2014.

DR CLARENCE TAM (NEW ZEALAND)

Sculpting Skool 101: Building Simple, Sexy Anterior Composite Restorations

Dr Clarence Tam is originally from Toronto, Canada, where she completed her Doctor of Dental Surgery at the University of Western Ontario and now maintains a private practice limited to cosmetic and restorative dentistry in Newmarket, Auckland. Clarence is the current Director and Chairperson of the New Zealand Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry and Member of the American Academy of Cosmetic Dentistry (AACD).

During this workshop the attendee will review the fundamentals in case assessment and suitability for layered anterior composite restorations and learn how to achieve predictable aesthetics using a modern, mathematically-modifiable nano-hybrid composite systems in Class IV fracture and full composite veneer situations. Participants will also learn how to incorporate certain maverick effects, namely hypoplasia and incisal effects such as halo and translucency and how to gauge and apply various layers of the restoration in a controlled, predictable fashion using a putty stent derived from a diagnostic wax-up or pre-operative situation.

This workshop will be held at The University of Queensland's newly constructed Oral Health Centre (UQOHC) at Herston in Brisbane which is now the nation's largest and most advanced tertiary oral health facility. The UQOHC is located alongside UQ's School of Medicine and School of Population Health, and is immediately adjacent to the Royal Children's Hospital. The UQOHC teaching facilities include the most modern clinical simulation areas, pre-clinical laboratories, lecture/seminar rooms, and research laboratories. Attendance at this workshop during Congress will give participants the opportunity to be amongst the first to see and use these new facilities.

DR MICHAEL WALKER & DR GREG MAHONEY (AUSTRALIA)

Review of Relative Analgesia – The forgotten art and treatment options

Dr Michael Walker BDS, FPFA is a past President of ASDA and is the University of Sydney Lecturer for diploma students in intravenous sedation, and is the senior clinical Associate and external Examiner in Intravenous Sedation. He teaches Dentists from across Australia the skills required for sedation dentistry. He has been treating anxious patients as a private practitioner since 1984 where Nitrous oxide inhalation sedation forms an integral part of his practice.

Dr Greg Mahoney, BDS, GradDipClinDent, MSc (Dent), PhD, FADI, FPFA has over 30 years' experience in dentistry and holds a number of key positions in prominent dental associations. He is the Australia Asia Pacific Representative for the International Federation of Dental Anaesthesiology Societies and President of the Australian Society of Dental Anaesthesiology (ASDA). Dr Mahoney has a full time private practice in Brisbane dealing with the anxious patient and has been involved in sedation research for the past 14 years.

This hands-on workshop is being held at the Brisbane Convention and Exhibition Centre. This workshop will be comprised of lectures in the morning session with the afternoon being a 'hands-on' interactive experience where participants will be given the opportunity to administer nitrous oxide - oxygen sedation on each other, and to experience themselves the effects of RA in a safe environment. This workshop meets the standards of the International Federation of Dental Anaesthesiology Societies.

The objective of the workshop is to enable participants to become proficient and confident in the administration of Relative Analgesia in clinical practice. It is also an excellent refresher for dentists wishing to update their theory and practical skills in the delivery of Relative Analgesia. The specific content of the workshop will include discussion of the following areas;

- What are the current legal requirements to use RA?
- Why did RA cease being used in practices and the machines ultimately end up in the corner?
- Why use RA over oral sedation?
- How to use RA properly
- Launching RA as a service in your practice
- The Dental Board's opinion
- Appropriate billing for RA procedures

DR MICHAEL MANDIKOS (AUSTRALIA)

Perfect Posterior Composites

Dr. Michael Mandikos is a registered specialist in Prosthodontics. He received his Bachelor of Dental Science Degree with honours, from the University of Queensland and in 1998 he completed a three-year residency program at the State University of New York at Buffalo (USA), graduating with a Certificate in Prosthodontics and Masters Degree in Biomaterials. His research was in composite resin materials and he has published several research papers in Australian and international journals on clinical and dental materials topics, as well as many clinical technique articles in local dental magazines. Aside from his private practice, Michael is a Visiting Specialist Prosthodontist to The University of Queensland Dental School and formerly to the Royal Australian Air Force. Michael has presented continuing education programs at Dental meetings throughout Australia, Southeast Asia and the USA.

The workshop begins with an explanation of the different dentine bonding systems presently available and recommendations are presented on which systems to choose. The main causes of post-operative sensitivity will be addressed, and attendees will learn of the possible effects composites have on the tooth they are being placed into. Clinical techniques will then be demonstrated for correct placement of composites to avoid all of these major problems. Broad, tight contact points, an even occlusion and perfect anatomy are all routinely possible when the appropriate materials, instruments and techniques are applied, and Michael will cover these in the workshop. The role of glass-ionomers and flowable composites will be covered in the context of their use as liner materials and recommendations for the use of the newer Bulk Fill materials will be presented. The second half of the full day workshop will be devoted to hands-on exercises for attendees to restore typodont teeth using the various techniques. Michael will demonstrate the placement techniques, step by step, and attendees will be able to use the recommended instrumentation and gain experience using several different restorative materials.

This workshop will be held within the new Continuing Professional Development and Training Centre located in the newly refurbished offices of the Queensland Branch of the Australian Dental Association in Bowen Hills in Brisbane. The ADAQ Simulation Laboratory was opened in 2013 and with modern and state of the art facilities has already hosted a range of hands-on workshops and clinical programmes to provide clinicians with the opportunity to gain enhanced knowledge and skills that can be implemented in their everyday dentistry.
