Message from the President



Dear Colleagues,

The 97th Annual Meeting of the American Radium Society will be held at the Grand Hyatt in Kauai, Hawaii from May 2 - 5, 2015. In keeping with the mission of our society, our scientific committee has put together an outstanding multi-disciplinary program. On behalf of the entire leadership of the ARS, I invite you to attend our meeting on the island. The theme of our meeting this year is **Integrating High-Tech with High-Touch in Radiation Oncology**.

The Scientific Program Committee, chaired by Dr. Benjamin Movsas, has recruited an extraordinary group of lecturers and panelists. Keynote speakers include **Professor Deborah Watkins Bruner**, an internationally recognized nurse scientist who has pioneered the use of patient reported outcomes. **Professor Takashi Nakano**, of the Gunma University Heavy Ion Medical Center, will discuss the ultimate in radiation oncology "high tech," the use of heavy ions to treat cancer. Our Janeway lecture will be delivered by **Professor Jay Harris** of the Dana Farber Cancer Institute at Harvard University. Dr. Harris is a world renowned clinician, educator and investigator with a career-long focus on the diagnosis and management of breast cancer.

I am honored to join this illustrious group of lecturers at the meeting by presenting my Presidential Categorical Course focusing on **Lung Cancer** on Saturday May 2, 2015. Speakers include Dr. Ritsuko Komaki on the subject of improving the therapeutic ratio in the treatment of lung cancer and Dr. Thomas Dilling on the subject of dose escalation. Also, I am excited this year to introduce a new feature of our meeting, a **Primer on Stereotactic Body Radiation Therapy** to be presented earlier in the day on Saturday. This will be an intensive group of presentations by experts in the field on the current state of the art in this technique across multiple disease sites including hepatocellular carcinoma, prostate cancer, spine tumors and re-irradiation.

During the course of the meeting, we will once again have the format of a live scientific debate on the role of radiation therapy in the treatment of **oligometastases**. In keeping with the high touch theme of the conference, we will have a special panel on survivorship and alternative care in addition to ones on the treatment of lymphoma and adaptive deformable imaging. Including other review lectures, we will be able to offer an **increased number of Self-Assessment Modules** to help our members fulfill their continuing education obligations.

I am excited to announce that the caliber of science and the number of abstracts submitted this year was stellar. We had a record number of applicant submissions which will lead to an outstanding set of scientific sessions and posters at our meeting this year. Also not to be missed are our **Case Based Tumor Board** luncheons focused on breast/gynecologic cancers and CNS/pediatric malignancies.

I have highlighted just some of the excellent programming we have in store for this year's meeting and I encourage everyone to read through the rest of this advanced program for more details. ARS is about to enter its **100th Year** and the annual meeting is a wonderful opportunity to mix education, science, networking and leisure.

The non-scientific portion of the meeting will take advantage of Hawaii's natural beauty and wonderful culture. We will all enjoy an authentic Hawaiian luau together on Sunday night May 3rd. 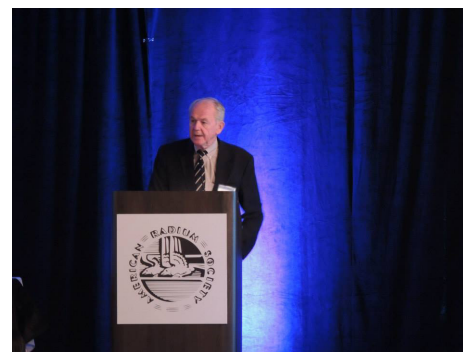
