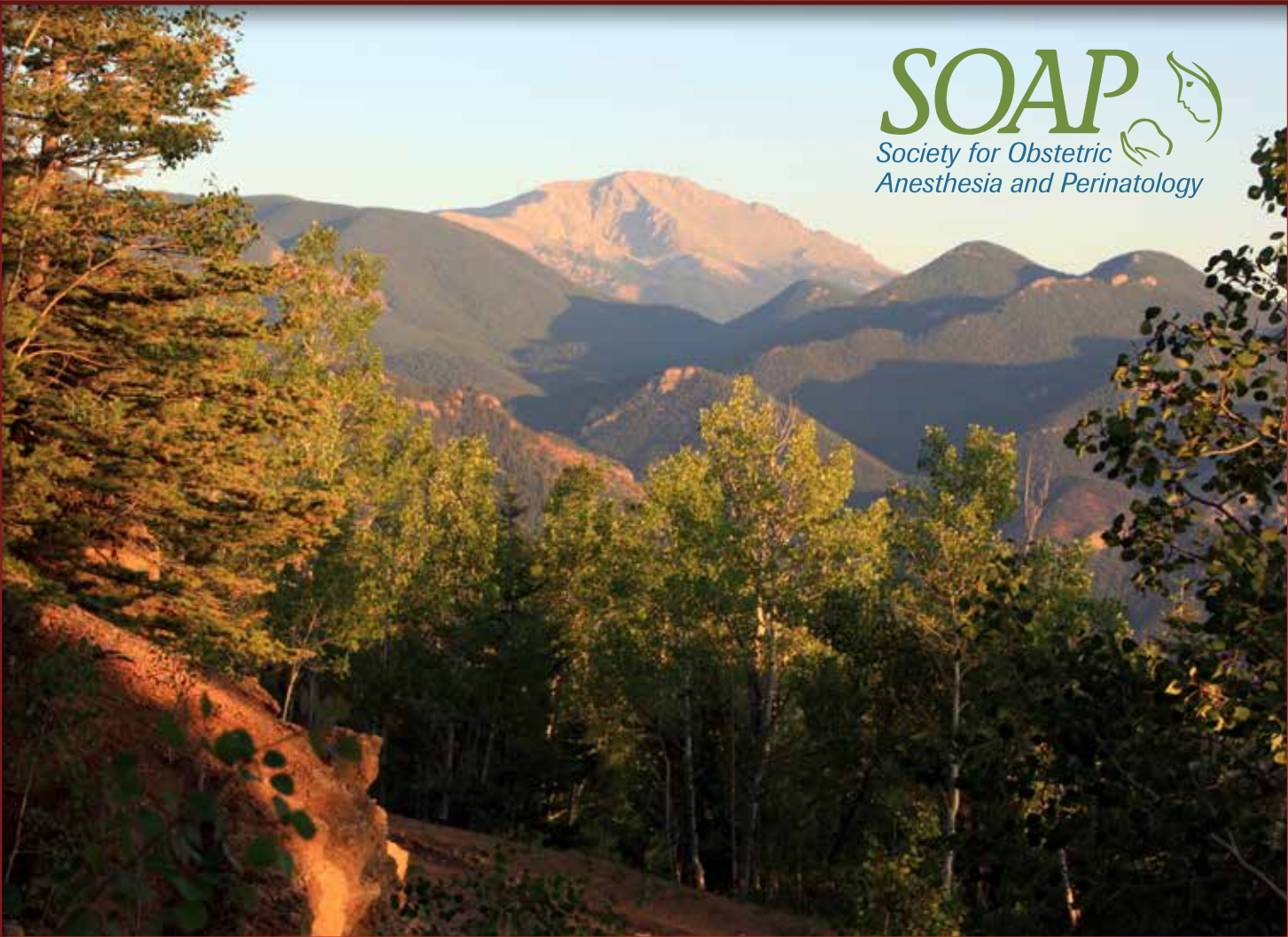

6. Discuss the role of professionalism and how it relates to education in the practice of obstetric anesthesia
7. Discuss how implementation of maternal early warning criteria can reduce maternal and fetal morbidity and mortality
8. Describe how to best teach patients about obstetric anesthesia
9. Describe the role of education in the practice of obstetric anesthesia and an evidence based approach to teaching obstetric anesthesia to medical care providers
10. Describe new and innovative clinical approaches in non-invasive fetal monitoring
11. Recognize factors related to academic success in obstetric anesthesia and apply that to career development and advancement

High Altitude Effects & Tips

High altitude has its benefits. Our bodies use more calories and burn more fat. But, for lowland travelers who are new to our area, altitude can produce some unusual high altitude effects such as dizziness, nausea and headaches. [Colorado Springs](#) climbs to an altitude of 6,035 feet. [Manitou Springs](#), just five miles to the west of Colorado Springs, is 6,320 feet. Further west, the towns of Victor and [Cripple Creek](#) are over 9,500 feet. The summit of [Pikes Peak](#) towers above them all at 14,115 feet. Below you will find some helpful high altitude tips to help you acclimate to our elevation.

To enjoy your visit here in Colorado Springs, here are high altitude tips to keep in mind to give your body time to adjust to the altitude and prevent altitude sickness:

- Stay below 7,000 feet the first day (the city of Colorado Springs is 6,035 feet above sea level.)
- Give your body time to adjust (there's lots [to see and do](#) at lower altitudes.)
- Avoid strenuous exercise the first day.
- Limit alcohol intake. Alcohol binds oxygen and water and robs your body of these two important nutrients.
- Drink more water. The air is drier and your body will dehydrate much more quickly. The higher up you go, the more water you should drink.
- Always travel with a companion. If someone begins to experience severe coughing, wheezing, shortness of breath or chest pain, get him or her to a lower altitude as quickly as possible.
- The effects of some drugs such as tranquilizers can be greatly increased at higher altitudes. Be sure to check with your doctor first before exerting yourself at higher altitudes.
- If you are baking during your visit, be sure to follow the high altitude instructions.
- Get plenty of good rest and enjoy yourself!

Gratuities

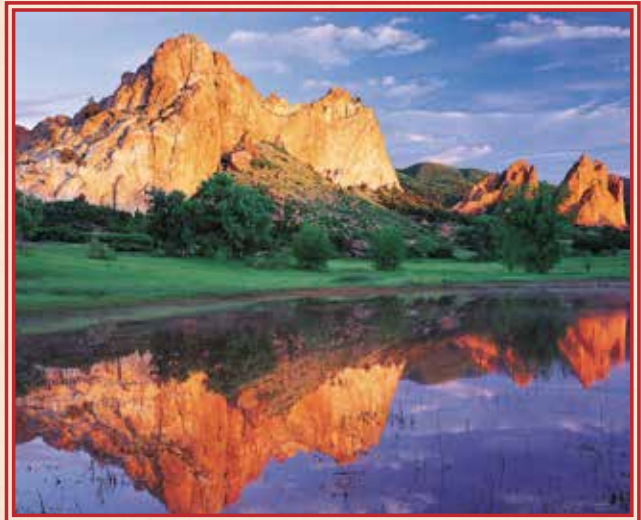
