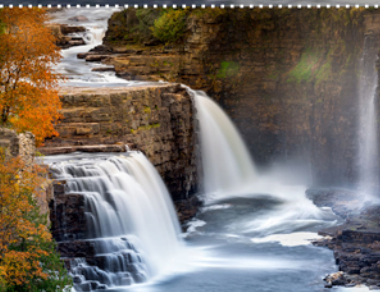

WHO SHOULD ATTEND?

- Become familiar with the newest advances in robotic surgery for male infertility
- Become familiar with challenging cases and their management in Urology
- Understand the risks and benefits of short term versus long term testosterone therapies
- Become familiar with new concepts in the medical and surgical management of priapism
- Become familiar with new concepts in testosterone restoration versus replacement in hypogonadism
- Understand advances in the medical management of lower urinary tract symptoms
- Understand advances in the minimally invasive surgical management of lower urinary tract symptoms
- Understand the meaning and treatment of nocturia
- Become familiar with new concepts in the treatment of prostatitis and prostodynia
- Understand surgical and systemic therapies for metastatic kidney cancer
- Understand the best treatment options for incontinence after radical prostatectomy
- Become familiar with best coding practices to increase practice efficiency for urology patients
- Become familiar with different ways to incorporate social media into the practice of medicine
- Understand legal pitfalls in the practice of medicine from social media, surgical innovation and off label use of medications
- Understand how to incorporate men's health programs in the general urology practice
