Summer Radiology Review 2015 Target Audience & Objectives

This course is intended for practicing radiologists. At the conclusion of this CME activity, the participants should be better able to:

- Interpret MRI examinations of the wrist, hip, and foot with emphasis on patients with ulnar-sided wrist pain, femoroacetabular impingement, and suspected musculoskeletal infection.
- Review the state of the art approaches to performance and interpretation of advanced MRI techniques, including fetal, renal, and head and neck.
- Gain an in-depth understanding of current status of molecular imaging, including newer PET agents.
- Understand the current options in lung, pancreatic, renal, and colon cancer screening and evaluation with emphasis on appropriate use of CT colonography and PET imaging.

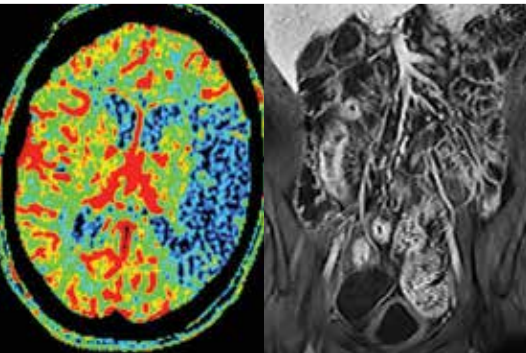
