About the Conference

The Annual Scientific Meeting of the Ohio Valley Society of Plastic Surgeons (OVSPS) serves a crucial role for students, residents, fellows and attending surgeons to highlight new technologies, new treatment modalities and new techniques in plastic and reconstructive surgery. In addition, the program serves to educate these individuals on patient safety topics and research occurring within the region thereby expanding the breadth and scope of plastic surgeons. Specifically, the meeting will include didactic and panel presentations to generate discussion involving new concepts and controversies in plastic surgery. The presentations are designed for audience interaction in an open forum allowing ample time for questions and answers.

A resident forum for research presentations is highlighted. This serves an important role in providing the opportunity for the resident/fellow to present his/her work in an open forum; an opportunity that may not be available at the national level.

Intended Audience

The target audience of this meeting includes plastic surgeons in practice and in training, both private and academic, in the five-state Ohio Valley region and beyond.

Learning Objectives

At the conclusion of this activity, attendees should be able to:

- **Explain the rationale for using autogenous tissue in breast reconstruction, identify the advantages of DIEP over TRAM surgery and identify best candidates for autogenous reconstruction.**
- **Compare the relative advantages of the pedicled TRAM versus the Free Abdominally-Based Flaps.**
- **Explain the steps to both maximize the advantages of DIEP and to minimize postoperative complications.**
- **Identify current market pressures within plastic surgery and describe income drivers for academic and private practices**
- **Explain primary reasons for physician turnover and discuss job search priorities**
- **Identify diagnostic tools for the identification of suspected breast implant-associated ALCL and explain the disease course and oncologic progression.**
- **Describe current first line and second line treatment modalities and the current clinicopathologic staging for ALCL and prognostic value.**
- **Review the most popular invasive techniques of facial rejuvenation over the decades.**
- **Describe current techniques based on a better understanding of how the face ages and volume replacement.**
- **Recognize and treat complications in facelifting.**
- **Identify specific options in selecting and planning a successful pathway that exemplified desired goals for retirement.**
- **Measure and organize alternatives of different occupations available and range of timing regarding Social Security benefits.**
- **Predict and evaluate potential issues of personal health, family financial needs, self and peer cognitive and skill assessments to better recognize the appropriate timing of transitioning from practice.**
- **Explain the history, orthoplastic approach and principles and become familiar with the role of VCA in limb salvage and reconstruction.**
