objectives

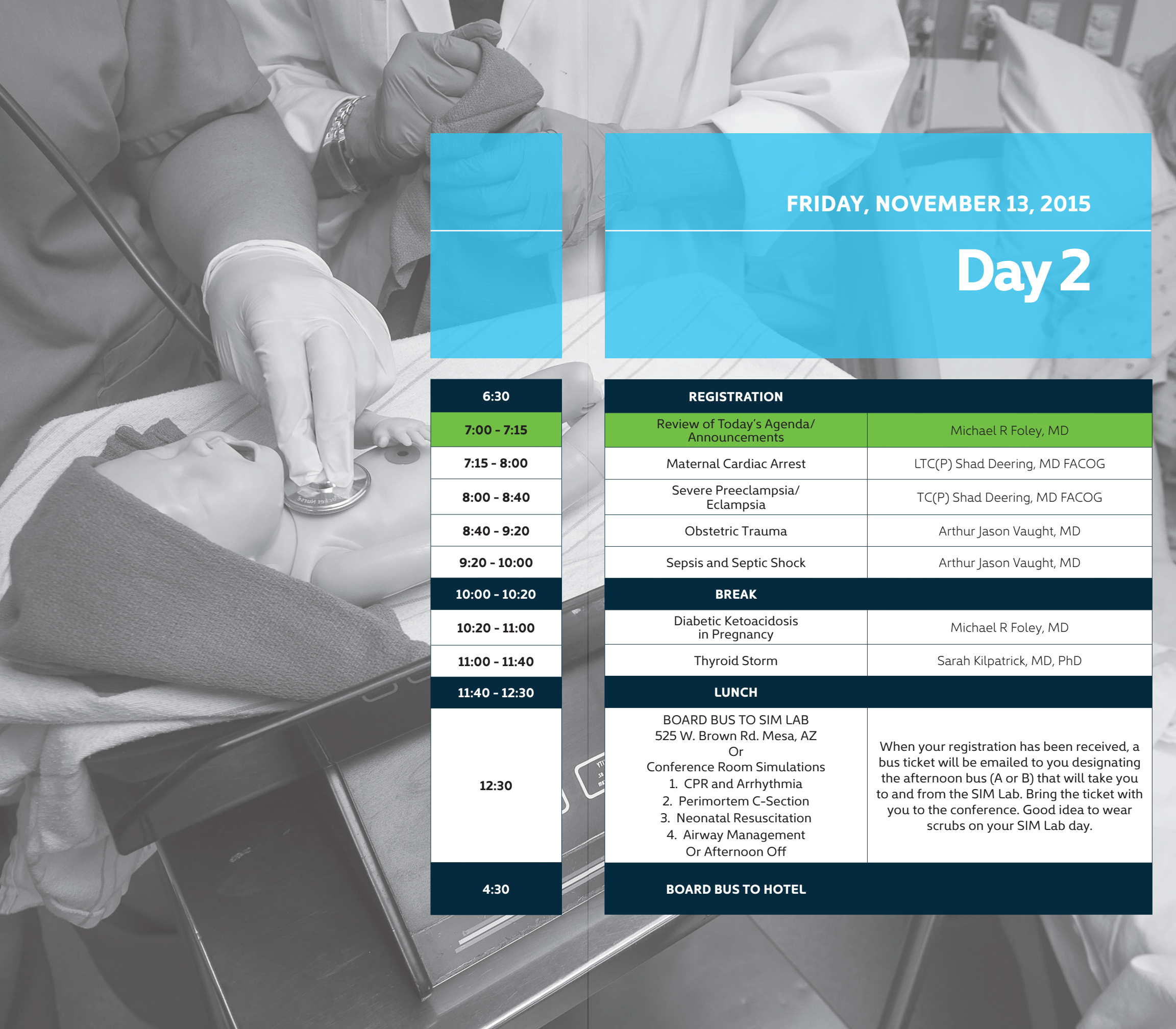
