- Recognize key morphologic features of purpuric lesions that help discriminate between likely pathophysiologies responsible for the purpura
- Recognize key distribution patterns of purpuric lesions that help discriminate between likely pathophysiologies responsible for the purpura
- Recognize typical cutaneous presentations of microvascular occlusion syndromes
- Review the pathophysiologies known for some of the entities in order to better direct therapy
- Review histological correlation to dermoscopic features
- Discuss dermoscopic algorithms and how to integrate them into daily practice
- Discuss pearls to optimize the execution of dermatologic surgery procedures
- Review strategies to ensure safety in dermatologic surgery
- Assess the role of dermal senescence in photocarcinogenesis
- Assess how geriatric skin differs from young skin in regards to UV responses
- Assess the potential mechanisms by which wounding therapies can protect geriatric skin from UV radiation
- Discuss opportunistic infections that affect HIV+patients and immunosuppressed patients
- Discuss challenges in diagnosis and treatment of cutaneous infectious disease
- Describe cases which are not seen commonly in general dermatology practice or dermatologic surgery
- Review signs and symptoms of uncommon diseases and differentiate them from similar commonly seen conditions
- Review the evaluation and treatment of less common disease to improve patient outcomes
- Identify newer developments in dermatology of which dermatologists should be awarded
