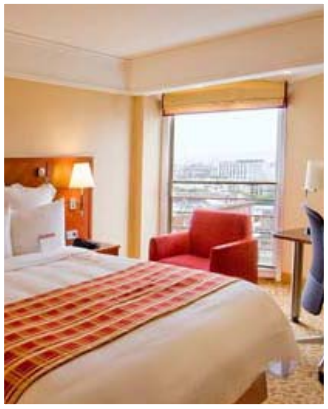

Paris Marriott Rive Gauche Hotel Situated in downtown with direct access to major airports, Paris Marriott Rive Gauche Hotel & Conference Center is conveniently located by the Latin Quarter and Saint-Germain-des-Pres.

The nearby metro station will take you directly to the Eiffel Tower, Champs Elysees, Montparnasse business district and Notre Dame in less than half an hour. Guest rooms feature 1 king or 2 twin beds (based on availability), comfortable Revive bedding, upscale shower products, air conditioning, hair dryer, robe, coffee/tea maker, safe, iron/board and more.
