NSNA's 70th Anniversary Convention is coming to SALT LAKE CITY!



Salt Palace Convention Center

The Convention takes place at the Salt Palace Convention Center, which is an integral part of the vibrant downtown scene of Salt Lake City. The first Salt Palace in Utah was built in 1899 but was destroyed by a fire in 1910. An indoor arena with the same name was completed in 1969 and was home to several professional sports teams while hosting concerts and other events. The arena was demolished, and a brand-new convention center opened its doors in 1996. Adjoined to the facility are the Utah Museum of Contemporary Art and Abravanel Hall, home of the Utah Symphony.

Many of the convention center's most striking visual features were obtained through the creative use of hollow structural steel in exposed applications. The entrance towers, delicate snowflake chandeliers, and grand five-story main concourse make the Salt Palace Convention Center part architectural showpiece, part modern art sculpture, and ready to welcome NSNA. With an elevation of 4,327 feet, Salt Lake City is surrounded by majestic snow-covered mountains. Just across from the Salt Palace, the City Creek Shopping Center offers visitors a "Passport to Shopping," with discounts and special offers from over 60 retailers and restaurants. With Salt Lake's museums, festivals, incredible shopping, and awesome live-music venues, you will experience the fun and excitement of this beautiful convention city.

Networking, leadership opportunities, endless educational sessions, and memories await you. Be prepared for excitement at the 70th NSNA Anniversary Convention!



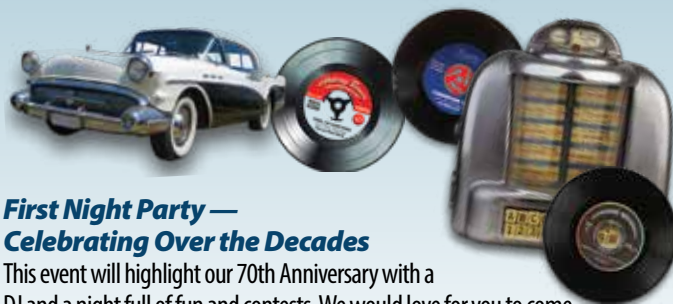
Karioth

NSNA is excited to welcome **Dr. Sally Karioth** as this year's keynote speaker! Dr. Karioth has taught more than 25,000 students in her nearly 50-year career at Florida State University (Including mentoring Myron Rolle in his receiving the prestigious Rhodes Scholarship) — a number that amazes and delights

her. A member of the FSU faculty since 1970, she is best known for her long-running class "Death, the Individual and the Family," which attracts students from all disciplines. She has also spent 20 years teaching in the FSU London Summer Program, and recently added a London spring break program. She is a Certified Traumatologist (CT) and grief counselor, and for more than 40 years, has been in private practice, helping people cope with the death of loved ones. Her particular concern is parents who have lost a child to death. She is also a well-known popular international public speaker, renowned for her ability to mix laughter with heartwarming insights. She graduated from Bellin School of Nursing in Green Bay Wisconsin and holds degrees from the University of Wisconsin-Madison, University of Florida and Florida State University that include two master's degrees, a PhD, and post graduate work in genetics at the University of London. But she considers her greatest award to be a job that every day allows her to walk into a classroom and teach.

Downtown Light-rail TRAX – schedule, lines, and cost information. Light-rail lines, called TRAX, provide access to Downtown from across the valley on three color-coded lines. Downtown Salt Lake provides a great transfer point as all the lines run through downtown. The Green line begins at the Salt Lake International Airport, runs through downtown Salt Lake and the out to West Valley City. At the airport riders can board at the station and Welcome Center just outside terminal one. Fare is \$2.50 and trains run every 15 minutes. Weekday service runs from 5:30 am to 11:30 pm, with a more limited schedule on weekends.
