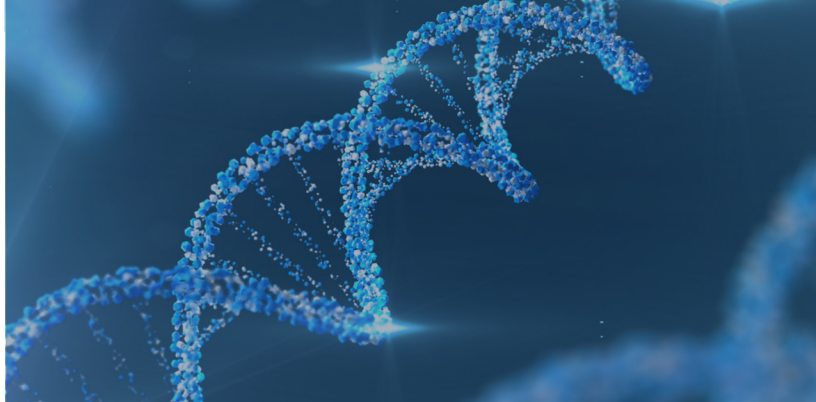

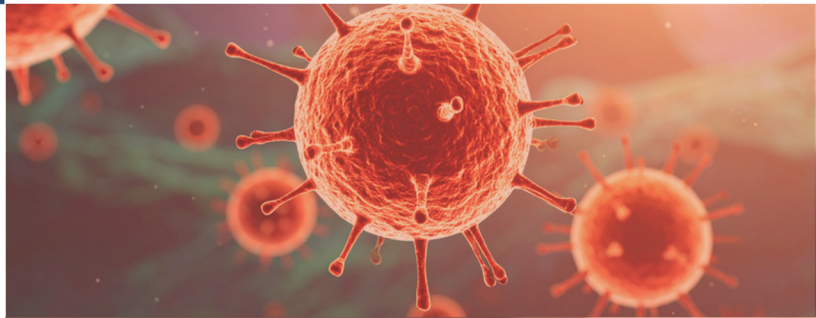

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The 2026 Great Strides Together in Oncology with Rapid Integrations Training, is a live, interprofessional continuing education program designed for oncology nurse practitioners, physician assistants, physicians, oncology pharmacists, clinical nurse specialists, and other members of the oncology care team who are involved in the diagnosis, treatment, and longitudinal management of patients with cancer.

This activity addresses evolving clinical practice gaps across the oncology continuum, including oncologic emergencies, advanced imaging interpretation, management of bone and liver lesions, immunotherapy toxicities, cellular therapies, cardio-oncology, theranostics, and ctDNA integration. Through expert-led presentations and multidisciplinary panel discussions, participants will strengthen diagnostic confidence, enhance therapeutic decision-making, and improve coordination of care in complex oncology settings.

The program supports both experienced oncology providers and advanced practice providers seeking to build foundational knowledge and clinical confidence. Emphasis is placed on evidence-based practice, multidisciplinary collaboration, and patient-centered strategies that improve safety, outcomes, and quality of care.

- Identify and manage cardiovascular and other systemic complications associated with cancer therapies to enhance patient safety.
- Implement collaborative, team-based care approaches that improve treatment coordination, medication safety, and patient-centered outcomes across the cancer continuum.
