HUGH HAMPTON YOUNG LECTURE: TREATMENT FOR LOW TESTOSTERONE IN 2021 - WHERE ARE WE NOW?

PETER SCHLEGEL, MD

Peter N. Schlegel, M.D., F.A.C.S., is James J. Colt Professor of Urology at Weill Cornell Medical College. Dr. Schlegel has developed novel hormonal therapies for men with impaired testosterone production, was principal investigator on US and international trials for GnRH agonists for prostate cancer, and has developed protocols for genetic testing of infertile men as well as to define the prognostic role of these tests in male infertility treatment. He has also developed performed and published on novel techniques for sperm retrieval for azoospermic men. His technique for sperm retrieval in men with non-obstructive azoospermia referred to as "microdissection TESE" has been adopted at many centers around the world as an optimal approach for treatment. He has treated over 4,000 men with severe male infertility.

Dr. Schlegel has published over 300 original manuscripts and dozens of book chapters. He has been an officer of numerous medical societies, including the Executive Council of the American Society of Andrology, on the Board of the American Society of Reproductive Medicine (Past President, 2020-2021), President of the Society for Male Reproduction/Urology, Society for the Society for Reproductive Surgeons, and Society for the Study of Male Reproduction. Dr. Schlegel has been a visiting professor, lecturer, and invited speaker at dozens of countries throughout Asia, the South Pacific, South America, Europe, and the Middle East.

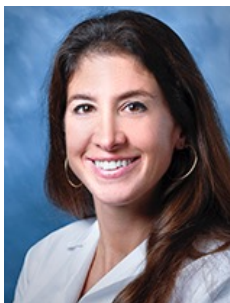

JEFFREY CADEDDU, MD

Dr. Jeffrey Cadeddu received his Bachelor of Science in Biomedical Engineering from Johns Hopkins University, and in 1993 received his Doctor of Medicine from Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine, where he also completed his urology and surgery residencies. He then joined The University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center in 1999, and currently holds the dual appointments of Professor of Urology and Professor of Radiology at that institution. In addition, he holds the Ralph C. Smith, M.D. Distinguished Chair in Minimally Invasive Urologic Surgery and serves as the Director of the Clinical Center for Minimally Invasive Urologic Cancer Treatment. His affiliations include membership in the American Urological Association, the Endourological Society, the Society for Urologic Oncology, Texas Urological Society,

and the Engineering and Urology Society. He currently serves as Associate or Assistant Editor on behalf of the Journal of Endourology, World Journal of Urology, and the Journal of Medical Robotics Research, and serves as a Survey Section Editor for the Journal of Urology. His publications include over 240 peer-reviewed articles; over 75 invited articles and book chapters; numerous editorial comments, book reviews and original videos. He is the recipient of the American Urological Association's 2007 Gold Cystoscope Award. He was elected to active membership in the American Association of Genitourinary Surgeons (AAGUS) and has served as co-president of the Engineering and Urology Society. He also has served as a panel member for the AUA small renal mass and localized prostate cancer guidelines.

JENNIFER ANGER, MD

Jennifer Anger, MD, MPH, is a dual fellowship-trained reconstructive urologist with extensive experience treating pelvic floor disorders. She completed a fellowship in urologic reconstruction, urodynamics and female urology with Dr. George Webster at Duke University Medical Center from 2003-2004. From 2004-2006, she completed her Master's degree in Public Health at UCLA under the mentorship of Dr. Mark Litwin, a pioneer in urological health services research. During that time, she received a National Research Service Award from the NIDDK for her work evaluating outcomes of sling surgery for stress urinary incontinence using Medicare claims data. In October of 2007, she received a mentored career development award (K23) from the NIDDK for her work involving the

development of quality-of-care indicators for women with pelvic floor disorders, "Evaluating the Quality of Urinary Incontinence and Prolapse Treatment" (EQUIPT). In October of 2009, she was awarded a challenge grant (RC-1) as part of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act to conduct a comparative effectiveness trial of robotic-assisted vs. laparoscopic sacrocolpopexy for vaginal prolapse. She was also site PI for the Cedars-Sinai site of the NIDDK-funded Multi-Disciplinary Approach to the Study of Chronic Pelvic Pain (MAPP) Network, in which she oversaw two basic science laboratories. She also has expertise in qualitative methods, including "digital ethnography" and social media analytics pertaining to lower urinary tract symptoms.

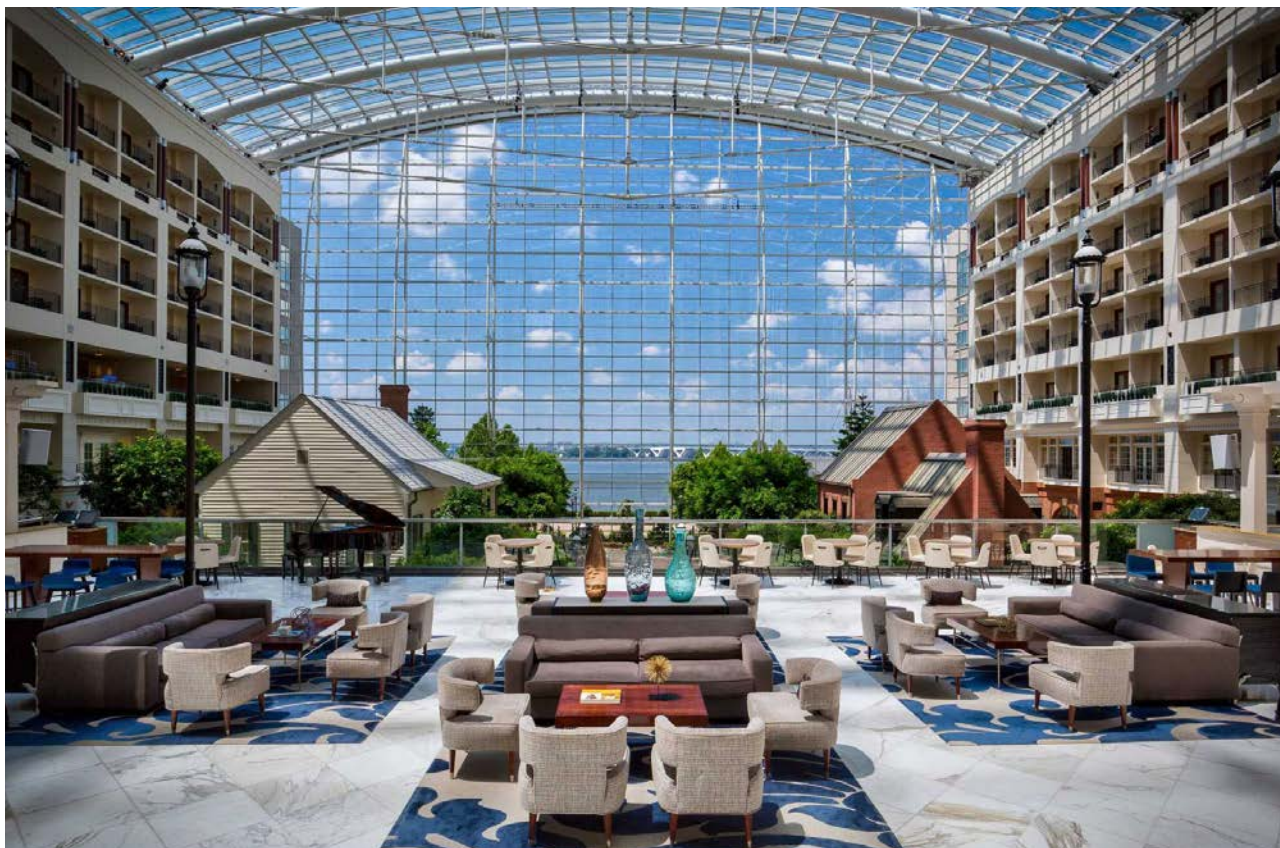
