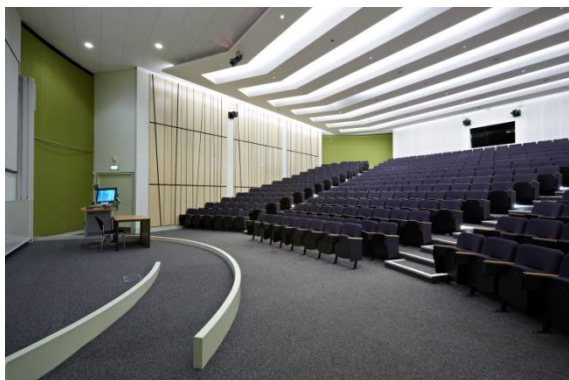

Breakout Sessions – Synopses

Friday 9th September

1. Female Genital Mutilation: Brenda Kelly

Do you know how to recognise female genital mutilation (FGM) and are you aware of your legal responsibilities? This workshop aims to increase your understanding of FGM and what to do if you diagnose a case.

2. The DipGUM - How to Pass: Dr Helen Colver

4. HIV Guidelines Update: Prof Rob Miller

5. Domestic Violence: Dr Rachel Sacks
