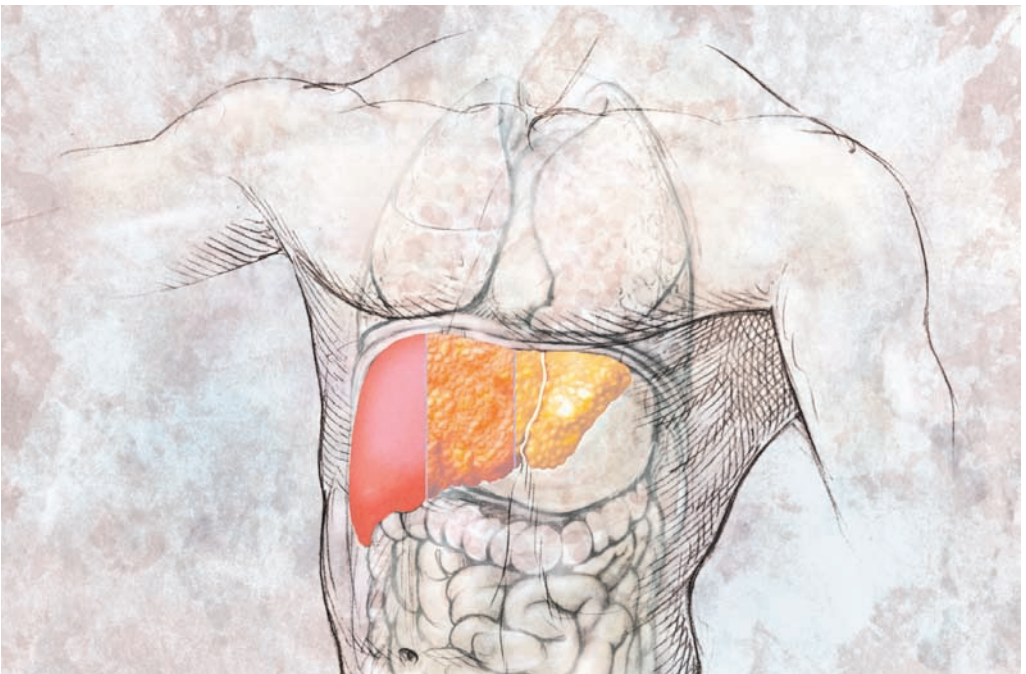
Course Description
