PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Whether you are new to implant surgery or looking to enhance your expertise, this comprehensive, 4-day live patient course is designed to provide participants with a complete mastery of dental implant surgery, covering everything from foundational skills to advanced techniques. Throughout the course, participants will be guided by a team of implant experts, including oral and maxillofacial surgeons and implant specialists who have over 3 decades of dental implant surgical experience. From digital scanning to CAD/CAM design, participants will work with cutting-edge technology and receive training the digital workflow for dental implant restoration.

Participants will learn how to utilize CBCT imaging for precise implant planning and predictability. Participants will perform both basic and advanced dental implant surgeries, as well as bone grafting techniques, including the use of PRF/iPRF (Platelet-Rich Fibrin) to create "sticky bone" for optimal graft integration. Under the continuous supervision of expert instructors at state-of-the-art dental universities, participants will conduct all live patient surgeries themselves, building the confidence to implement these procedures in their own practices. By the end of the course, participants will be fully equipped to offer dental implant surgeries to their patients with precision, predictability, and success.

UPON COMPLETION, YOU WILL BE ABLE TO:

- Provide diagnosis, prognosis, and properly sequenced comprehensive treatment plans.
- Apply the recommended guidelines for a safe and appropriate dental implant placement.
- Perform Basic to Advanced Dental Implant Surgeries: Under the guidance of expert faculty, participants will progress from fundamental implant placement techniques to more advanced surgeries to elevate confidence and skills in complication management and enable the confidence to take on implant cases in a variety of clinical situations.
- Perform comprehensive examinations, collect clinical data, and document the patient's dental and medical condition.

- Bone Grafting and PRF Techniques: Learn essential bone grafting techniques, including the use of PRF/iPRF (Platelet-Rich Fibrin) to enhance healing and stability, and create "sticky bone" for optimal graft integration.
- Master the Digital Workflow: Learn the complete digital workflow for dental implant restoration.
- Utilize CBCT Imaging: Understand and apply CBCT (Cone Beam Computed Tomography) imaging for implant predictability and planning. This course emphasizes how CBCT technology enhances accuracy in implant placement, helping to avoid complications and ensure long-term success for patients.

WHAT TO EXPECT ON THIS PROGRAM?

You will encounter various kinds of dental implant cases and surgical procedures. All patients are preselected, screened, and evaluated in advance for each course participant. Our Dental Implant Live Patient Program is designed to help you master the essential foundations of Dental implant surgery, from incision and flap design to implant placement and suturing. With full hands-on training, you will be guided by our expert faculty through each critical step, ensuring you develop a comprehensive understanding of the skills required for successful implant restorations. Personalized instruction and ongoing evaluations by our expert instructors will ensure that you receive focused guidance on the areas where you need the most improvement.

The number and type of procedures you perform will depend on your skill level, surgical experience, the time required to successfully complete each procedure and your performance, as continually evaluated by the course instructors, during the course. Our expert faculty will continuously assess your performance, tailoring the learning experience to maximize your progress and build your confidence in performing dental implant surgeries effectively.

Every morning, on the days of live patient surgery, we have a short lecture and a meeting with all the doctors to review the treatment plan and medical history for the patients that you will be treating that day. In that moment, with the X- Rays in hand, we evaluate the cases and discuss the best treatment plan and approach for each patient.

FACULTY

You will have the advantage of being trained by oral/maxillofacial surgeons and Implant Specialist. Our faculty has been involved in dental humanitarian missions, academic exchanges, and specialized in the field of oral implantology for over 3 decades. SCHEDULE

The program is 4 full days. The first day will consist of Lectures and hands on workshops on suturing techniques and dental implant placement on models. The following 3 days are dedicated to Live Patient Surgery. We require that you arrive to the course destination one day before the start of the course.

ADMISSIONS APPLICATION

ITC Seminars' Advisory Committee, composed of members of the faculty, select the most highly qualified applicants to receive offers of admission. All admissions decisions are made by the Committee. Offers of admission are made on a rolling basis until the course is filled. Applicants are notified via email once the admissions decision has been made so please ensure that your email address remains current.

The admission decision will be based upon your performance in previous academic programs, the corresponding quality of those programs, competitive resumes, and performance as a dental practitioner. Personal factors, as evidenced by outreach efforts, extracurricular and leadership activities are also key factors.

Final Review Stage

Once all required application items (1-6) have been received, a virtual interview with members of our Advisory Committee may be scheduled as the final stage of the admissions application process. This interview will assist the Committee in making a decision regarding the applicant's admission to the course.

Upon receiving an offer of admission, doctors will receive the course registration and payment authorization forms via email to reserve their seat in the Live Patient Program.

Admission Requirements

1. *Resume or CV*

Resumes must include any prior CE activity completion, name and type of CE course(s), and the total number of Dental CE hours/credits earned prior to applying for admissions to ITC Seminars Live Patient Program. CE courses are recommended to be ADA or AGD certified or approved by the Dental Board of the State granting your dental licensure.

2. *Copy of valid Dental License.*

3. *Copy of valid CPR certification.*

4. *Copy of Dental School Diploma.*

5. *Applicants are required to complete the online surgical experience survey ([Link to Surgical Experience Survey](#)).*

6. *Applicants are required to provide evidence/proof of experience in PDF or PowerPoint Format.*

a. Applicants who have placed:

1. 0 implants, please refer to section 6.b. and 6.c.
2. 1-5 implants must submit 1 case and certification and any verification of participation in a past academic or CE course, program, or seminar in oral implantology (must include total number of CE hours/credits).
3. 5-10 implants must submit 4 cases and certification and any verification of participation in a past academic or CE course, program, or seminar in oral implantology (must include total number of CE hours/credits).

4. 10+ implants must submit 8 cases and certification and any verification of participation in a past academic or CE course, program, or seminar in oral implantology (must include total number of CE hours/credits).

Fully document the required number of cases. Documentation must include patient slides, pre and post-operative x-rays and clinical photographs of final cases, scans, pre-operative evaluation and planning forms, treatment consent forms, and chart notes. Please note that 2+ implants in the same patient counts as 2+ different cases.

OR

- b. Applicants who have no experience in placing Dental Implants on live patients must submit verification of participation in a minimum of 16 CE hours of Dental Implant Training. At least 1 dental Implant training must have included a hands-on workshop on dental implant placement on models. CE provider(s) must be certified by the ADA, AGD, or Dental Board of the State granting your dental licensure.

OR

- c. Applicants without any experience in dental implant placement or previous dental implant CE training ***are still allowed*** to apply to this program and will be carefully evaluated by our Advisory Committee for offers of admission.

Admissions Application Submission

All admission application requirements and materials must be submitted to ITC Seminars. There are three ways to submit your application: email to itcgolive@gmail.com, fax to (949) 460-0042 or mail to the ITC Seminars Central Office. Applicants are encouraged to apply for admission at least 2 months before the start of the Live Patient Program. Applicants are required to send all admission requirements together at the same time. Applying early can help you avoid delays, allow for timely processing, and improve your chances of being admitted to the live patient program. Applicants will be notified of their admission status within 2 weeks of submitting their complete application.

For candidates who receive an offer of admission, a program registration form will be emailed to the applicant in order to reserve their seat in the CE course.
